I had a Guidance Lesson today on... ACCEPTANCE!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Ms. Colflesh, our school guidance counselor came into our classroom today and taught us a guidance lesson on the value of ACCEPTANCE. Here are some things we did:

- Talked about what Acceptance means: "Knowing that everyone is just right the way that they are; We have different strengths/weaknesses and ways of doing things and that is OK; We all belong and have something special to share"
- Discussed the importance of learning about Acceptance:
 - Helps us get along, understand, learn about, and include others; reduces teasing. When we show "acceptance" to all we are helping to make the world a more peaceful place.
- "In Their Shoes" activity
 - Students were shown the shoes and read some background on several different people and their differing abilities.
 - Students were given time to try and experience what it may be like "stand in their shoes"
 - Students reflected on what they would want others to say/do for them when they are "in their shoes" and how they can do this for others

Now, I will tell you one thing that I learned from the guidance lesson:
