

# Accomplishments 2014-2015 Alder Elementary







## We are proud of **Alder's** many accomplishments this year, including:

- Push-in literacy support models: English Language
  Development teachers and classroom teachers collaborated
  weekly with co-teaching.
- Title I program provided in-the-classroom support for students.
- Significantly reduced office referrals for behavior. Embraced
  the concepts from Engaging Students with Poverty in Mind and
  trauma-informed instruction from Defending Childhood in ways that
  avoid exclusion and punitive consequences for disruptive behavior.
- Students on target in IRLA has increased by over 68% from the same time last year.
- Monthly PBIS assemblies have been a huge success. Students and teachers celebrate success of all our students.







At Davis, we are proud of many things! Our community of learners have accomplished great feats in the name of student achievement. Here are some examples that transformed our school this year:

- Teachers ushered in a new era of sheltering instruction for English Language Learners with the Content Integrated English Language Development Push-in model.
- Staff dedicated time and energy towards raising student achievement and IRLA proficiency in our classrooms. We doubled our results for students on target and increased total students proficient by 13%... That's 65 more students reading at grade level!
- Purchased engaging and leveled text for all students.
- Project GLAD fully implemented in our classrooms. Our teachers and specialists collaborated to create engaging and rigorous units of study for our kids.
- Implemented PBIS to celebrate student success and engage students at Davis. Celebrated students at Self-Manager Parties, Spirit Assemblies, and spirit days.
- Increased Parent Involvement... Books and Breakfast has been a smash hit at Davis. Our parents come every Tuesday morning to meet with staff to discuss literacy and math at home as well as current events at the school.
- SUN Partnership yielded great benefits, The Oregon Food Bank provided produce and Franz Bakery by provided bread to our families.
- Offered ESL classes for adults and outreach for families in need.
- Placed 4<sup>th</sup> at the Battle of the Books district competition. Way to go Dragons!!!

### We are proud of **Fairview's** many accomplishments this year, including:

### **Academic Programs and Support**

• Students received: full day kindergarten, technology for teaching and learning, flexible grouping for Title I reading and math support, focused intervention support and enrichment opportunities in reading (additional 45 minutes per day) and math (additional 30 minutes per day).

Through our volunteer programs, we have been able to provide students with a Summer Kid's Club, reading support, school supplies, field trips, and more!

 All Fairview teachers received training and participated regularly in Project GLAD strategies, the IRLA reading assessment, and Professional Learning Communities (PLC).

- Established multiple school wide attendance policies to address chronic absenteeism.
   Worked with Communities Supporting Youth to address attendance issues county-wide.
- Implemented a school wide PBIS system for common areas and established some baseline expectations for classrooms school wide. Had PBIS awards and recognition assemblies. Launched a PBIS CARE's program to target behaviors after spring break.


We are proud of **Glenfair's** many accomplishments this year, including:

# Hartley Elementary





### We are proud of **Hartley's** many accomplishments this year, including:

- Reading Challenge results: students read for 23,786 hours between Winter Break and Spring Break 2015.
- Implemented restorative justice approach to student support. Increased direct support to most needy students, and subsequent decreased out-of-class time for those and other students. Pro-social skill building increased with this approach.
- Increased the number of students exiting ELD service through scoring on the ELPA. Increased in the number of students advancing a full proficiency level this year.
- Instituted weekly Reading and Breakfast program as an extension support provided efforts. Coaching for families on how to improve Literacy support for students at home.
- Currently 61.3% of students are reading at the proficient level or higher—a significant increase.

 Hartley Community Carnival brought families, community and school together for an evening of low cost fun and prizes.

- Increased community and family volunteers; established a Volunteer of the Year award.
- Created Take One, Leave One libraries around Margaret Scott so parents and students can take a book home without a formal checkout process.
- Implemented Imagine Learning language development program.
- Hosted Stand for Children parent education class in Spanish this spring.
- Received a grant for a no-cost breakfast and lunch for all students.
- Became a site for SUN Community School with Boys and Girls Club of Portland as the provider.

# Wilkes Elementary


### We are proud of **Wilkes'** many accomplishments this year, including:




- •1st-5th grade teachers trained in Project GLAD units and strategies in the classroom, making content more comprehensible for our English language learners.

- Provided culturally specific programs with Self Enhancement Incorporated, El Programa Hispano, Latino Network and IRCO
- 50 Nike staff organized an all school field day event and supplied students with 50+ pairs of shoes.

# Reynolds Middle







### We are proud of **Reynolds Middle School's** many accomplishments this year, including:

#### **Academic Growth:**

- Students in Title I reading achieved one year or more growth in reading.
- Students who were significantly behind achieved an additional 1/3+ year's growth as measured by IRLA.

#### **Student Discipline:**

- Disciplinary referrals declined by 20% from prior years. A decline of over 600 referrals in two years.
- Disciplinary referrals within all race groups have declined.

#### **Family Involvement:**

- Fall Parent/Teacher Conferences were attended by 82% of parents.
- Spring Parent/Teacher Conferences were attended by 70% of parents
- 115 people attended our annual AVID Family Night.
- Hosted our first Black Parent Night.

#### **Curriculum and Instruction:**

- Staff embraced the use of Schoology as a communication vehicle and tool for student interaction.
- Sheltered instruction implemented in all classrooms; reflected in SIOP at 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup> grades and GLAD at 6<sup>th</sup> grade.
- All students have been IRLA assessed.

#### **Technology:**

 Moved closer toward our goal of 1:1 student technology with additional purchase of iPads.

- RMS piloted the use of Surface Pro3 & short throw projector technology.
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade core teams used Schoology formative assessments communication as well as a virtual homework folder.

#### Music and the Arts:

- The RMS Advanced Orchestra placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the annual Mt. Hood Orchestra Festival.
- Band and Choir programs continue to produce stellar performers.
- RMS staged for theatre productions.

#### **After School Activities:**

- After school sports were expanded.
- 500 students participated in SUN over the course of the year.
- Provided transportation home from track practices.
- SUN Soccer Teams were provided transportation to and from soccer games.



# Walt Morey Middle

### We are proud of Walt Morey Middle School's many accomplishments this year, including:


- SLIP language exam granted world language credit to over 100 students.

# Reynolds Learning Academy





### We are proud of **Reynolds Learning Academy's** many accomplishments this year, including:

### RLA West's accomplishments:

- Staff focused efforts on reading strategies.
- The Class of 2015 is the largest graduating class.
- Implemented a PBIS student recognition program, called the CRAIG Awards, through a \$50,000.00, five year donation from the nonprofit Observation Tower.
- Implemented two Phoenix Cohorts allowing over 50 students to access that intervention program.
- Continued to increase our level of community involvement, holding family involvement evenings one time per month.
- MYC and Trades continued to strengthen their partnerships increasing their field learning experiences.
- Reynolds Learning Academy implemented end of the quarter activities, allowing students in need of additional academic assistance to gain access to that help. This resulted in 10% increase in students passing all 8 of their classes.


