

Abington Cyber Education (ACE) Program

Maintain a Connection with Abington School District through this K-12 Online Learning Option provided by Brandywine Virtual Academy

Since 2011, the Abington Cyber Education (ACE) program has provided students residing in the Abington School District with the opportunity to learn in an online environment while having access to the supports that are available from the Abington School District administration and its schools.

Developed by the Chester County Intermediate Unit and the 21st Century Cyber Charter School, all courses in the ACE program are approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and meet the Pennsylvania State Standards.

A K-12 Virtual Option that is Aligned with a Traditional School Program

Curriculum with Multiple Platforms

- Multiple platforms provide flexibility for different learning styles and give the Abington Cyber Education program the ability for customization, including an option for students to take some classes in person and some online.
- Special content area offerings at the elementary level and electives across the secondary level are available, as well as AP, Honors, Credit Recovery, and NCAA-approved courses for high school students.

Highly Qualified Teachers

• The attention and *personalization* of the learning experience for students is provided by highly *qualified* and certified teachers.

Ability to Stay Connected

• Students can maintain their *enrollment status* and take part in existing Abington School District extracurricular activities such as sports, drama, music, clubs and more.

Challenging Coursework

While the Abington Cyber Education program provides a flexible schedule
that allows students to complete the educational program outside of the
structured school day, students will find the course work to be rigorous
and demanding.

Individualized Attention

Although students attend school virtually, they still maintain the benefits
of having a school-based advocate (either a guidance counselor or
school administrator) who will work with them and their parents/
guardians to determine whether the ACE program is a good fit, and to
select the appropriate courses in which these students should enroll.

- Remain enrolled in Abington Schools with the ability to rejoin classes at the end of a semester/ marking period without disruption (or choose to take certain classes in school, like Music or Science).
- Abington Cyber Education students outperform their cyber charter school peers on state assessments.
- Students in the ACE program will have access to the guidance services and after-school sports and activities that the Abington School District provides to its students (secondary students maintain their counselor).
- Students will receive a laptop computer, high-speed Internet access, and a Pennsylvania Department of Education-approved curriculum taught by Pennsylvaniacertified, highly qualified teachers.
- The Abington School District ensures that the educational program and the curriculum meet the Abington School District's and the PA Department of Education's standards.
- Abington School District students who meet graduation requirements and who successfully complete the ACE program receive an Abington School District diploma.
