3. **Found Objects Color Wheel:** Create a color wheel out of found objects in your house. Draw what you see in front of you. Include color if you can!
4. **Drawing Activity:** Imagine you are a bird in a tall tree looking down on your neighborhood. What does it look like? Draw what you think the bird would see.
5. **Find a piece of art around your home.** How does it make you feel? Why do you think it was created? What materials were used to create it? What is the style of the art? Can you think of an artist who has similar style? Write at least ten sentences to answer the questions.
