Activities to Support Instruction During Extended School Closures

The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of suggested activities available to ACPs students. These suggestions can be used by families to support the continuity of education. The learning experiences developed and provided will give students opportunities to go deeper into concepts, ideas, and skills independently. These activities do not require copies or additional supplies.

Art	Fun Journal Prompts: Complete one journal prompt each week. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Create an art journal. Write your name on it and draw pictures around it. Use as many colors as you want. Make it your own! Keep the journal in a safe place.• Think about ways that your art teacher has shown you how to make art. What is your favorite way so far? Write it down in your art journal you created or talk about it with someone.

	Activities: Complete at least one activity each week. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Go outside or look outside of your window. Look at all the colors and shapes. Draw a tree and an animal that you see. Use as many details as you can: Add color if you want!• Make a silly drawing: Draw a shark eating a cupcake or combine two animals to create a new one. Use color if you like!• Create an Aluminum Foil Sculpture: You will need a piece of aluminum foil (tear about 6-8 inches off the roll) and scissors to create one or more foil human or animal figures. Let your imagination be your guide!• Ice Cube Watercolor Painting: Make frozen watercolor paint sticks by mixing food coloring with water in an ice cube tray or small paper cups. Put a toothpick or popsicle stick in each color and place in the freezer. When the paints have frozen, pull out the ice cubes and use them to paint a picture. Notice how the colors change as the ice cubes melt?!• Make an "All about me" collage by cutting pictures out of magazines or any materials you can find. You can even draw or color if you would like. Be creative and have fun!
