Simon Sinek's "The Golden Circle" is a simple yet powerful graphic illustration of the importance of knowing ones "why?" Although it was designed to be used within the realm of business, it has great adaptability in terms of educating students.

WHAT

The Golden Circle

Every organisation on the planet knows WHAT they do. The products they sell or the services.

HOW

Some organisations know HOW they do it. These are the things that make them special or set them apart from the competition.

WHY

Very few organisations know WHY they do what they do. WHY is not about making money. That's a result. WHY is a purpose, cause or belief. It's the very reason your organisation exists. Sinek describes his graphic this way: "The Golden Circle" provides compelling evidence of how much we can achieve if we start everything we do by first asking a simple question: "why?"

So, what is your why? Why do you do what you do? After several weeks working with Accomack teachers and staff, my conclusion is this: you are here for the kids. You are here to help them become the absolute best versions of themselves. There is no doubt that this why permeates our school division. You should be very proud of this...and you should constantly be reminding yourself what your why is.

Let's be honest. January through February are particularly difficult months for teachers and students. Now more than ever it is important to reflect on our why. Friends, I am no different than you. I have to constantly remind myself what my why is; otherwise, I lose focus and forget why I do what I do... and then I become discouraged. I hate feeling discouraged.
