Taking the ACT and SAT

- You've taken the PSAT and now have a good idea of what to expect on the SAT.
- The ACT is also a major college entry exam accepted by virtually every school in the country as is the SAT. ACT is divided into English, Reading, Math, Science Reasoning, and an optional writing section (which we recommend everyone take) as opposed to the SAT which is the same as the PSAT.

- ACT test dates for the rest of the year are: 10/23/10, 12/11/10, 2/12/11, 4/09/11 (this is the date offered at Chardon High School), and 6/11/11*
- SAT test dates for the rest of the year are: 10/09/10, 11/6/10, 12/4/10, 1/22/11, 3/13/11, 5/7/11 (this is the date offered at Chardon High School), and 6/4/11*
