

# Action Scenes

Project Brief: Create an action scene that is 3 minutes long that has a mid break in action dream sequence. Use greenscreen to create a scene extension, particle elements like explosions or fire to produce a realistic effect. Tell a simple story with conflict that makes the character make a decision about something at the end. ‘

**This will be part one of your final exam grade. Part two will be on the day of the final.**

You will be assessed on the following criterias

- Develop an original action scene with a clear storyline and characters
- Use basic camera techniques to film their scene effectively
- Collaborate with their group members to create a cohesive scene
- Present their final action scene to the class with confidence and clarity.

## Required Elements

1. Particle effects must be used at least once. Whether it's rain, fire, explosion, snow or anything else that needs to be incorporated into the scene that originally wasn't there.
2. Character must go through some sort of dreamlike reality break. Whether they are falling through into a different dimension or teleported somewhere and then thrown back into the action scene. Whatever **IT** is there will be a clear break into something else.
3. Scene must be between 2:30 and 3 minutes.
4. Export at H264 HD 1920x1080
5. Must have a title and end credits displaying who did what
6. If you work with someone each person must have a position that directly affects the overall project. You can't let someone else do all the work.
7. Consider props and costumes for characters
8. Camera work: You must have five different types of angles

**Part 2 will be a process paper about your action scene. You will write about your role, the camera angles used, teamwork and your vision for the scene.**

Overall Impact - <i>The scene should leave a lasting impression on the audience, with a sense of excitement, tension, and satisfaction.</i>

Cinematography <i>incorporated five different shots. The camera angles, movements, and framing should add to the tension and excitement of the scene.</i>				
Editing - <i>The editing should be precise, with cuts and transitions that enhance the flow and impact of the action.</i>				
Acting - <i>The actors should deliver convincing performances that make the action feel realistic and engaging.</i>				
Visual Effects - <i>Seamless integration into the scene</i>				
Plot Integration of Dream Break - <i>Character breaks from the action to go into a dreamlike break and then goes back to action</i>
