2. What plant does the fiber come from? cotton
3. Why is it made of narrow strips sewn together? Because they are made and sold locally
4. What causes the fabric to turn yellow in the first step? Water infused with cengura
5. What is a motif? Design How does the artist decide on the patterns to use on the cloth. By their different meanings.
6. IN designing your mud cloth you will select patterns.

Pattern name	meaning of pattern
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Wara kalan Wolo	A panther's skin
Seben Koloni	The small old amulet
Ce Farin Jala	A brave man's belt
