

The elementary robotics team in Vermillion was very successful last year and two teams consisting of many St. Agnes students hopes they'll be successful again. You might be wondering what exactly the teams do. Each team has a VEX IQ kit with snap together pieces which they use to make a robot that can maneuver within a 4x8 course to score as many points as possible with programming, driving by yourself, and driving with a different team.

Last year the Vermillion Area Robotics Club team 1008B consisted of Dominic Herrera, Lydia Anderson, Caleb Reins, and Sydney Johnson, Caleb Mayrose, & Roz Olson. The course last year was called Ringmaster. The team had to pick up rings and put them on horizontal and vertical posts. Drivers also could push down two buttons on a bonus tray and it would release 20 rings. Last year 1008B won a total of eleven trophies some of which included: two Excellence, one Teamwork Champion, one STEM Award, & three Design Awards. The team traveled all around the U.S.A. from Nebraska to Louisville, Kentucky, where they competed in the World Robotics Competition.

This year the course is called Next Level. Teams have to stack hubs in two building zones. There are also two bonus hubs that are worth double points. There is also a bar to hang on for points. This year there are two clubs in Vermillion, ROV and VARA. Both clubs formed out of the old VARC organization. VARA stands for Vermillion Area Robotics Association and ROV stands for Robotics of Vermillion.

In ROV there are currently two teams, 57069W The Wolves (the elementary team) and 57069J The Jack In The Bots (the middle school team). On the Wolves team there is Isaac Mayrose, Dominic Herrera, Caleb Chasing Hawk, Caleb Reins, (all fifth graders at St. Agnes) and Alex Port (a fourth grader at Jolley). VARA's all girls team is called The Queen Bee's and includes Lydia Anderson, Sydney Johnson, Kyla Mockler, and Catie Naber. All teams have been successful so far won regional robotics competitions. They will be competing in December and through the spring and have a big tournament in Vermillion at the Coyote Sports Center in February. 

Ray Ring and Nancy Rasmussen beat John Gors and Gregory Baldwin for State Representative in Clay County. Rasmussen got 4,373 votes, Ring got 4,352, John Gors got 3,607, while Baldwin got a small 829 votes. For State House, Dusty Johnson got 202,673 votes in South Dakota, while Tim Bjorkman got

121,002 votes. This means Dusty Johnson beat Tim Bjorkman

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
