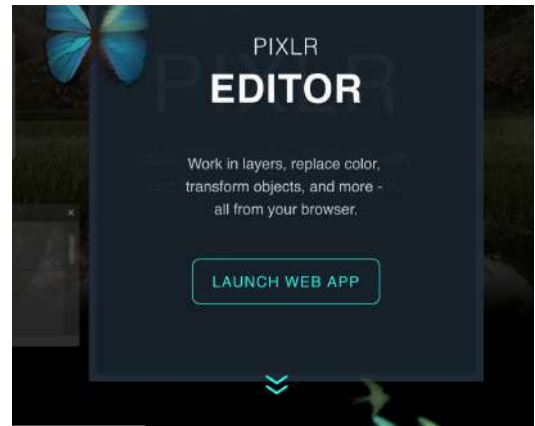


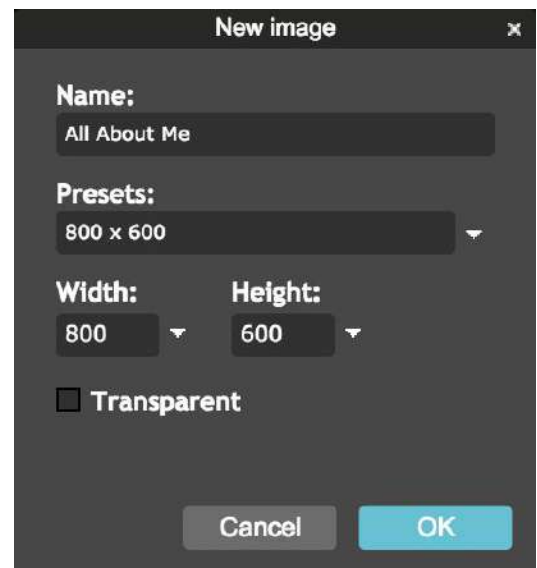
DIGITAL COMPOSITE: ALL ABOUT ME

Goal: Use your knowledge of Pixlr selection tools to make a collage of images that represent yourself.

1. Go to www.Pixlr.com. Scroll down and choose Pixlr Editor, *not express*.



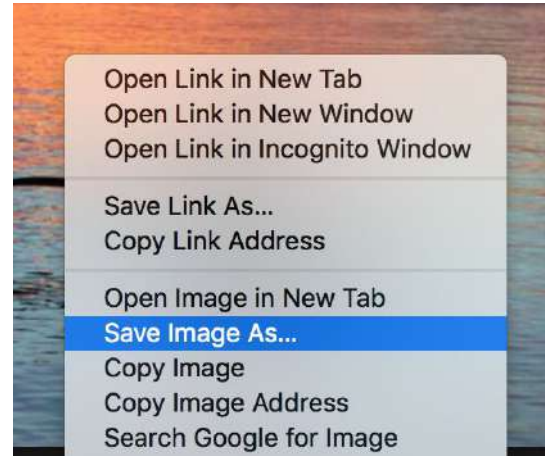
2. In Pixlr, make an 800x600 resolution document and title it ***YourName***_All About Me Collage.



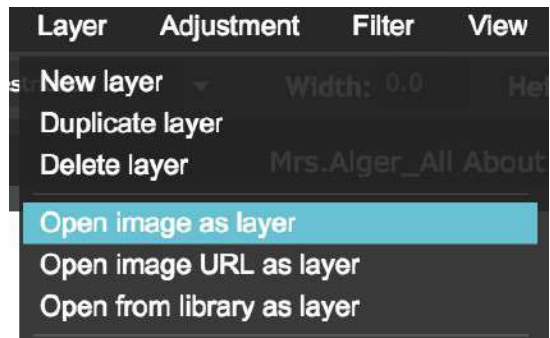
3. Choose one photograph that represents you.
Open it in Pixlr.

- a. Save the image into your google drive
by right clicking and saving the photo.

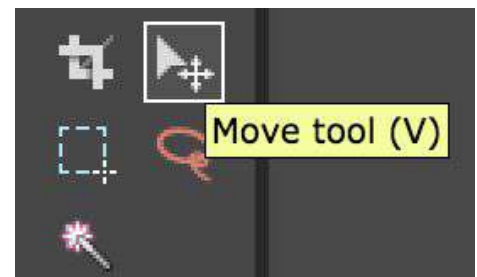
Then in Pixlr go to Layer > Add Image
As Layer.



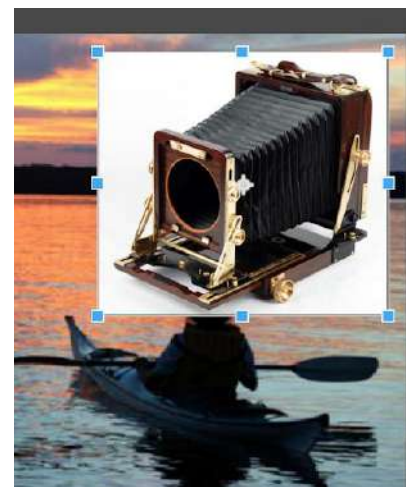
- b. OR open the photo directly from
google images. In Pixlr go to Layer >
Add image URL as Layer. First
google search a photo. **Be sure
to click “view image” before
copying the URL of the photo
you choose** (copying the google
link won't work).



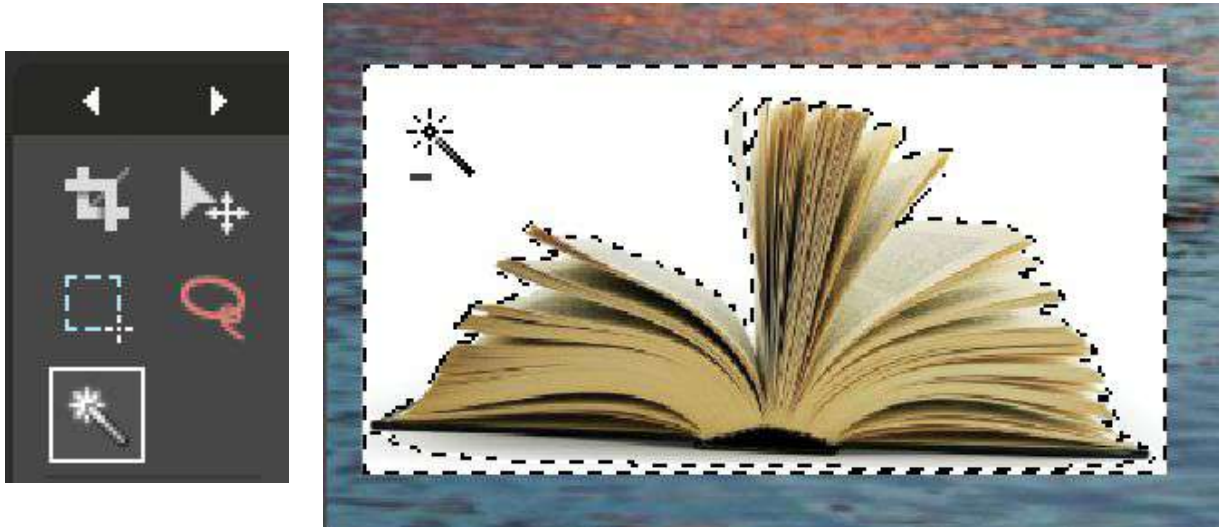
4. Once the photo is in Pixlr, you can move it using
the move tool (in the tools bar on the left hand
side).



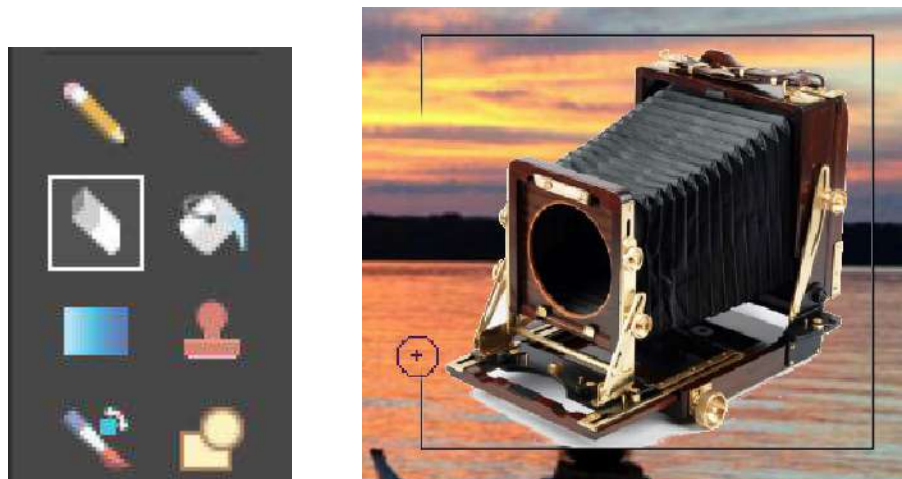
5. If you need to resize an
image, go to edit > free
transform.



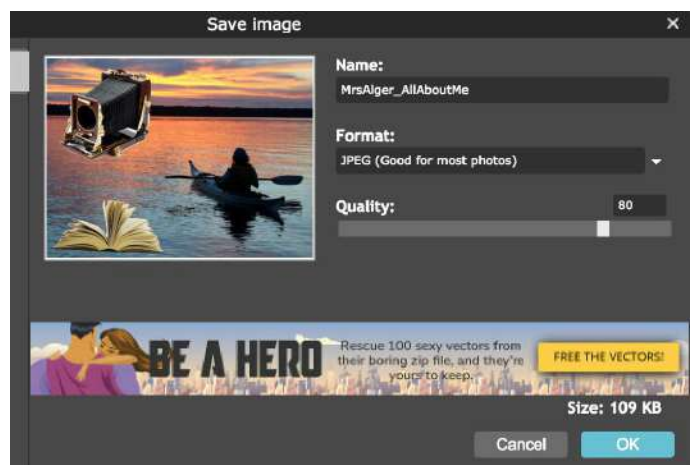
6. If the photo has a background, use the selection tools (magic wand, eraser, etc), cut out the background. ***To deselect click CNTR + D or go to Edit > Deselect All***



If there are extra bits of the background left after using the magic wand, use the eraser.



7. Repeat this at least 2 more times, adding at least 3 different photographs to your composite and erasing their backgrounds.
8. **Save your work as a PXD until you are completely done with it.** Only when you are done do you save as a jpeg and post onto google classroom. File > Save As



Performance Criteria:

1. Your composite must include at least 3 photographs
2. At least 2 of your photographs must have the backgrounds erased.

Rubic:

Criteria 1: Composite	I only have 1-2 photographs in my composite.	I only have 3 photographs in my composite.	I only have at least 3 photographs in my composite.
Criteria 2: Selections	I did not erase any backgrounds.	I erased the background out of at least 2 photos, but the selections still have lingering parts of the background.	I erased the background out of at least 2 photos, and the selections are excellent - there are no lingering pixels. My selections are very clean.
