It may be renewed on a yearly basis, upon reapplication and subsequent qualification, for an amount of not less than \$1,000.00, such amount to be determined annually by the Foundation's Board of Directors.

Funds available through this scholarship will be payable directly to the educational institution in which the recipient is enrolled. Please return all required documentation along with the attached application form to the Glacier High School Career Center no later than Thursday March 7, 2024.

Prior to releasing any scholarship funds the recipient must return, to the Foundation, a completed scholarship grant acknowledgement form and verification of admission to and enrollment in a qualified educational institution. Scholarship funds may be distributed in one or two payments (one per semester) at the discretion of the Foundation's Board of Directors.
