Test Format:

- -35 multiple choice
- -6-7 "map" questions--know where the event occurred and be able to find it on a map
- -5-6 primary source questions --read a primary source passage and interpret
- -short answer/essay
- -Make sure you look at your timeline and know the chronology of events. You don't have to memorize dates, but you need to know the order of major ones.

What to Know:

-What was the Proclamation of 1763? Who supported it? Who was against it?
-Who wrote <i>Common Sense</i> ? Why was it important to the colonial cause?
-What type of tax was the <i>Stamp Act</i> ? How was it different than the taxes put on imports?
-What was the immediate cause of the <i>Boston Massacre?</i>

-Why was Paul Revere's famous painting of the <i>Boston Massacre</i> considered "propaganda?"
-When did the First Continental Congress meet? What event caused them to meet?
-When did the Second Continental Congress meet? What event prompted their gathering?
-The Boston Tea Party was in response to which event? What angered the colonists about it?
-What was England's response to the Boston Tea Party?
-What was the Olive Branch Petition?

-Which writers/philosophers inspired Thomas Jefferson as he wrote *The Declaration of Independence?*

Where did the Revolutionary War "officially" begin? Was independence a war aim mmediately after it occurred? (Hint: check the date of this event vs. when ndependence was actually declared)
What happened at Valley Forge? Where is it located?
Why was The Battle of Princeton/Trenton considered a turning point for the colonists?
Why was the Battle of Saratoga considered so crucial to the colonial cause? (Hint: Fhink about future success)
Where did the British finally surrender? What state was this in? Whose help was crucinere?
