- Average to high test scores
- 2.0-3.5 GPA
- College potential with support
- Desire and determination

Meets One or More of the Following Criteria

- First to attend college
- Historically underserved in four-year colleges
- Low income
- Special circumstances




They believe in AVID! (They really do!)





AVID teaches Note Taking strategies for your classes.




AVID Teaches time management skills!

- Students support each other in pursuit of their common college goal










Fall 2014 Visit to Winona State and St. Mary's University
