

Environmental Art

Definition: Artistic work that is intended to enhance or become part of the environment or make a statement on environmental issues.

• Art created directly in the landscape and made with natural materials, such as rocks, leaves, sticks, flowers, water, snow, mud, pinecones, etc.

Also known as "Earth Art", "Eco-Art", and "Land Art".

Environmental Artists

- Environmental artists are aware that the landscape will change over time with the seasons and weather.
- Although some environmental art creations are long-lasting, most are temporary and degrade over time.
- **<u>Ephemeral Art:</u>** An artistic creation that is transitory and exists only briefly.

Photography

- Andy Goldsworthy is also a photographer.
- He documents his temporary "ephemeral" creations in nature with photography.
- Photographs tell the story of his artwork.





'He shows respect for nature and the environment when creating his artwork by only using things that he finds in nature; that way he can leave his artwork the way it is without any damage being done to the environment around it'.

"Each work grows, stays, decays – integral parts of a cycle which the photograph shows at its heights, marking the moment when the work is most alive".






What materials does he use to create his art?

"I enjoy the freedom of just using my hands and 'found' tools–a sharp stone, the quill of a feather, thorns".




Goldsworthy is generally considered the founder of modern rock balancing.
