What are some of the reasons why the Roma are discriminated against?

- 1. Family- teach us language, values, walk, eat....
- 2. Peers-what is appropriate with our age group
- 3. Rituals and ceremonies teach us our culture values
- 4. Schools teach us curriculum, social skills, reinforce ideas of right and wrong
- 5. Media-movies ,videos, newspapers ,internet etc.... increase our knowledge base and contribute to what we value
