Choose **one** of the novels or plays from the list. If none of these titles capture your interest, send me an email at beckerr@leb.k12in.us and I'll help you find one that does. If you are having a difficult time making a decision, send me an email and I can try to guide you.

Assignment Details

1. You will need a copy of your book choice in print (ebook or paper book) that you can use for the first 3-4 weeks of school. You may rent from the library or purchase your copy.
2. Just read the book. Find one you like and enjoy reading. Maybe you and some friends will choose the same book and form a reading group!
3. You need to read the book in full before the first day of class. Some of these titles have been made into films. Do not substitute the film for the book; you won't be able to do your work well in August and it will likely bring you stress. If you read the book and also want to watch the film, that is fine, but make sure you have read the book well so you can distinguish it from the film.
4. Be prepared to do the following with your book of choice when you come to school in August:
 - Discuss with me and others who have read the same title.
 - Engage in discussion with peers who have not read the same title.
 - Analyze writing style and literary elements of excerpts from the text.
 - Analyze key characters citing evidence from the text.
 - Form thematic arguments and defend them using evidence from the text.
 - Develop your formal writing skills, using your text as your subject matter.

You will not do any assigned writing or note-taking from your reading experience over the summer. Just read the way you like to read. We will do the written work when we start class in August.
