- ✂ Please note: additional fabrics and supplies may be required according to student skills, interest, and time available

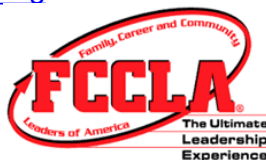
Optional Supplies
