As Spring approaches, we are finishing our last year of the Montana Comprehensive Literacy Project (MCLP) Grant which was funded through the Federal Striving Readers Comprehensive Literacy Program. We began the grant in the Spring of 2019.

The MCLP's ultimate outcome improved the literacy skills of our children and students across the district. Over the course of 4 years Sun River Valley Public Schools received approximately \$900,000 to advance literacy skills, including pre-literacy skills, reading, and writing for children from birth to grade 12. As anticipated, MCLP was a beneficial grant for our District.

As we get close to the end of the school year, school safety is always on our minds and we continue to be proactive. We are currently updating our camera system at Simms High School and will do the same at Fort Shaw Elementary before school starts in the fall.

We are very fortunate to live in a great community and I thank you for your continued support of our students and staff.

FFA NEWS

Most people look at the current pandemic and the resulting closures as all negative. For Simms FFA and its members it has opened a lot of doors. The National FFA Convention was held virtually. For our six Agri Science student winners this resulted in pre-recorded interviews. For the rest of the chapter, this meant they could participate in National Convention! We were able to hold a chapter wide watch party for the Welcome Session and students were given the opportunity to explore the career show, leadership workshops, and additional sessions.

FFA can be expensive for members because of travel costs and the amount of school they miss if they are involved in competitive events. This year, the John Deere Ag Expo held in person events at regional levels and some events virtually. This permitted all the Simms members to participate. The high school Ag Science classes had been studying range science so they all participated in the Range CDE. The middle school Ag classes had been studying Poultry and Food Science so they competed in those events.

There have been numerous opportunities for students to participate in zoom calls and other trainings that were made available.

Montana Chamber of Commerce sponsored a student business pitch competition called "The Prospects." Simms students were able to communicate with sponsors and enter the competition. We are anxiously awaiting the results to see if Simms students will receive prize money.

SIMMS FFA HAS STATE STAR FINALISTS

Experiential and work-based learning in school-based agricultural education allows local programs to extend beyond the classroom and into the community in order to develop an individual student's industry and career-based competencies.

Chad Hitchcock is a Finalist for Star in Ag Placement. Chad works for Skogen Ranch and Hitchcock Quarter Horses. He works with 2200 head of cattle and farms 4500 acres. They have about 20 breeding mares. Chad helps with everything from feeding to genetic selection and planting to storage of crops.





Peter Johnson is a Finalist for Star in Agribusiness. Peter operates a lawn mowing business. His company is responsible for about 30 lawns per week. He has three employees. Peter handles all aspects of the business from contacting customers to managing the books.



TENNIS TIME



High School tennis teams around the state will start their competitive seasons on March 15th. In addition to Girls Tennis at SHS, High School Boys will now have an opportunity to compete in this great sport, too. Coach Pasma and Coach Green look forward to this season for a variety of reasons. Obviously, the opportunity to compete this season after remaining idle last spring fills not only the athletes with excitement, but the coaches, too. At the tennis interest meeting held in February, fourteen athletes expressed an interest in competing in tennis this Spring. For the first time in a few years, Simms will fill an entire tennis roster with a solid core of players who know and understand the game. Hopefully, some young men from SHS will find their way to the tennis courts to learn a sport they can truly play for a lifetime. (The SHS coaches are living proof of that claim.) This season, Simms High School will compete in a new division with teams from Conrad, Cut Bank, Choteau, Great Falls Central and Valier.

Most of the Varsity Matches will be played at Invitational tournaments held around this area - Great Falls and Helena. Tentatively, JV matches will be held on Tuesdays at the Choteau, Fairfield and Simms courts on a rotating basis. With that format in mind, hopefully our JV players will have the opportunity to play more matches this season with certain COVID restrictions still in place. At this time, the coaches and our AD will work to finalize our competitive schedule. Please check the school website for updated matches, times and locations. Match competition will begin in April.

Adult Education Tennis lessons - In the past, tennis lessons have taken place through our Adult Education program. Last summer with COVID restrictions in place, the school and instructors did not offer any tennis lessons. This could change this summer, but we don't know for sure at this time. Those who have taught the lessons in the past will work with the school's administration and the program director to see if we can make this happen. 

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



World's Best Fudgiest Brownies

Prep: 10 min Cook: 25 min Total: 35 min Servings: 16



INGREDIENTS

- 1 cue 8oz/240e unsaited butter, melted and cooled
- 2 tablespoons (30ml) vegetable of
- 1 1/4 cups (902/260g) white suger
- 1 cup (7cs/200c) packed light brown super
- 4 (202/57g each) large eggs, at room temperature
- 1 tablespoon (15ml) pure vanilla extract
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (3.5oz/130g) all purpose flou
- 1 cup (3.5cs/100g) good quality, unsweetened coccus powder
- 7 or (200e) roughly choosed chocolate or large chocolate chips

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 175°C | 350
- Lightly grease an 8x12-inch baking pan* with cooking oil spray. Line with parchment paper (or baking paper); set aside.
- Combine melted butter, oil and sugars together in a medium-sized bowl. Whisk well to combine. Add the eggs and vanilla; beat until lighter in colour (another minute).
- Sift in flour, cocce cowder and salt. Gently fold the dr ingredients into the wet ingredients until JUST combined (do NOT over beat as doing so well affect the texture of your browniss).
- Pour batter into prepared pan, smoothing the top out eventy, and too with remaining checolate discas.
- Bake for 25-30 minutes for fust under-done brownies (fudgler texture) or until the centre of the brownies no
- OR 35 40 minutes if you like your brownies well set
- NOTE: Brownies will continue baking and set in the hot pan out of the over. If testing with a tootholds, the tootholds should come out dirty for fudge-testured brownies.
- After 15-20 minutes, carefully remove them out of the pan and allow to cool to room temperature before slicing into 16 brownies. They set while they cool.
