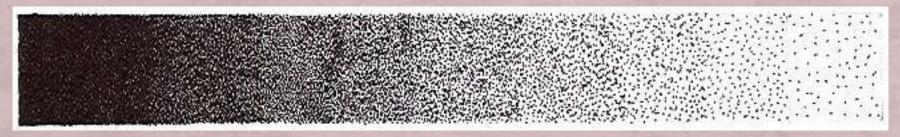
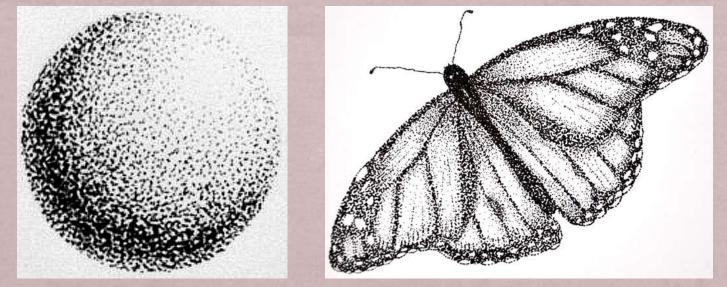

#### **STIPPLING**

- + Stippling = shading (showing values) with dots.
- + The closer together the dots are, the darker it seems
- + The further apart the dots are, the lighter it seems.

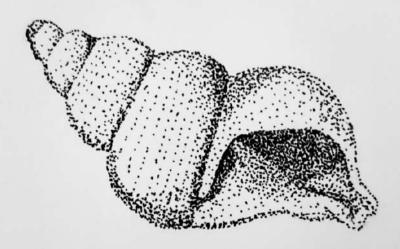






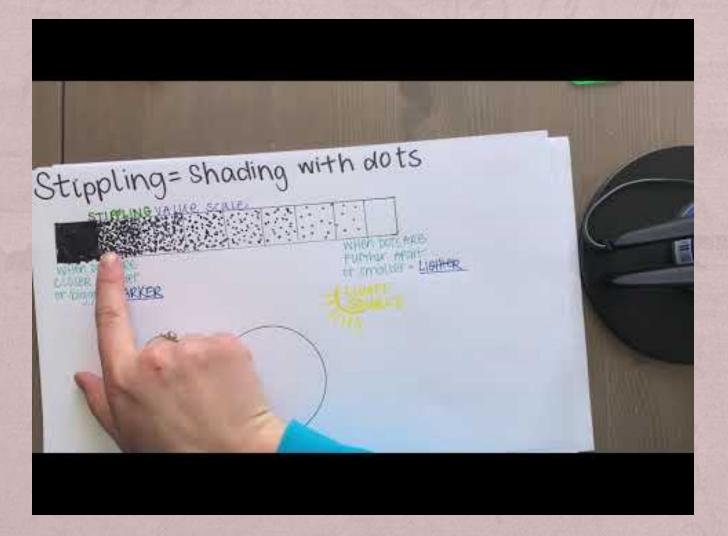

#### **CROSS HATCHING**

- + Cross hatching = Showing values with lines.
- + The closer together or thicker the lines are, the darker it seems.
- + The further apart or thinner the lines are, the lighter it seems.



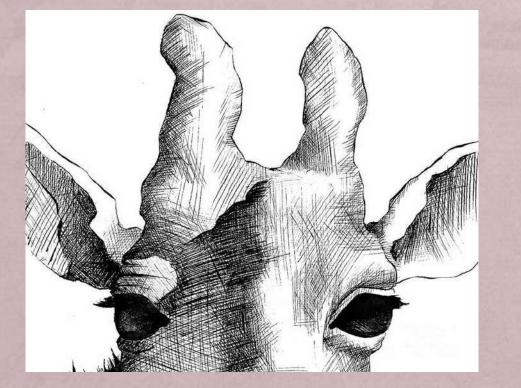

+ Expressive Lines= Lines
that express an idea,
mood, or quality.

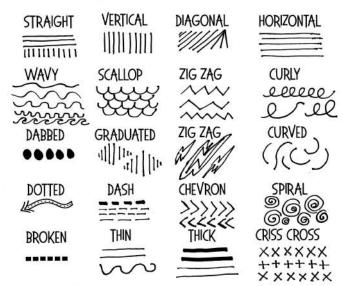


#### EXAMPLES

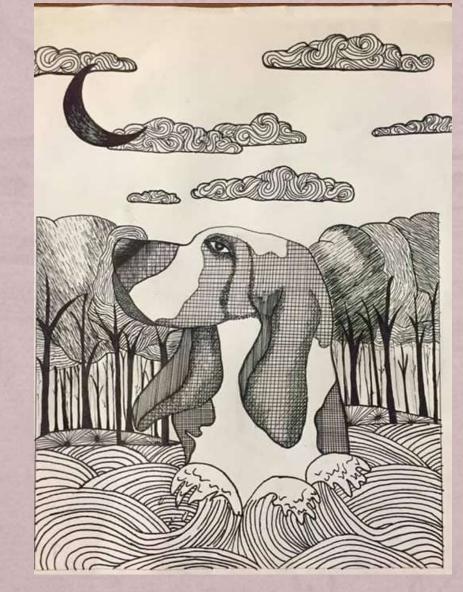


A path created by a moving point, mark or object.

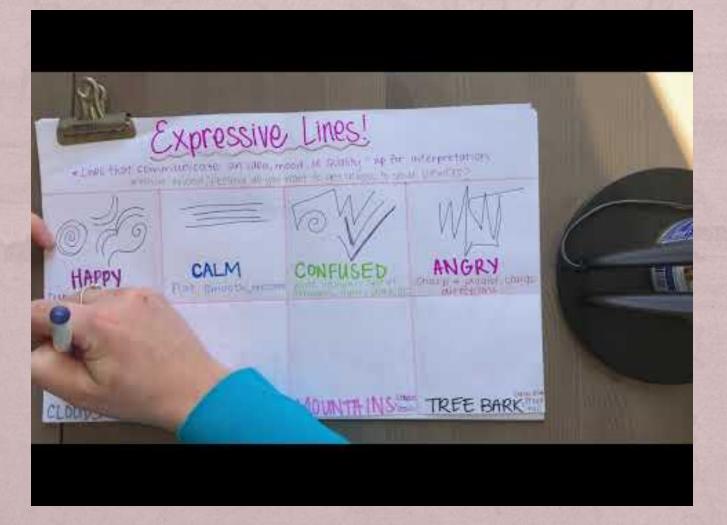
There are many types of lines: thick, thin, horizontal, vertical, zigzag, diagonal, curly, curved, spiral, etc. and are often very expressive. Lines are basic tools for artists.



A line's width is sometimes called its "thickness". Lines are sometimes called "strokes", especially when referring to lines in digital artwork.
