F. High School Student Organization Report - no report tonight

Dr. Nagler introduced Joe Owens. He stated he was happy to be here tonight. He thanked the board for having us here to recognize some outstanding artists and allowing us to take over your halls for the past week. He went on to say everyone should check the calendars because there are art shows going on in every building in May. Mr. Owens went on to say we have five wonderfully gifted teachers in our district who work very hard and under their direction our students create upwards of 10,000 pieces of art over the course of any given school year, one piece better than the next. He stated it is amazing as you walk down the hallway to see a progression from kindergarten through 12th grade. You can really see how we are really developing skills and not just highlighting our most talented children. Margaret Ballantyne - She thanked District Council for a wonderful evening last night at the SEPTA dinner. She congratulated them on winning the President's Cup. Margaret said she is looking forward to the party SEPTA will be hosting for all the children in the district on Saturday at the high school from 1-4 pm and the SEPTA meeting on Monday. K. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent of Schools' Reports for 4/20/2017 Presentations:

Professional Development for Teachers

Dr. Nagler reported he worked on professional development for our teachers with Mr. Gaven and Ms. Burns and tonight Mr. Gaven has a report.

Mr. Gaven thanked the board for the opportunity for the vision that's afforded us the opportunity to always look at things in a new way all for the betterment of our students. He reported last spring we discussed about how our building administration and central office administration was structured and the board was aware of these discussions. In these conversations we realized over the past few years we have made changes in our curriculum and in our instruction. The current structure of last spring was not aligned with what we want in terms of our district mission. Through these conversations we've had the opportunity and the gift to come together with a new structure all for the betterment of our students. We now have 6 instructional leaders who are based out of central office but they are mostly in the buildings. Originally the Instructional Leaders were going to provide professional development and do observations. This has evolved in the last 8 months. Mr. Gaven announced that Nicole Culella could not be here tonight because she was delivering her dissertation and as of tomorrow she is Dr. Culella. He stated he does not know of another district that has a structure like ours. Our theme is Recognize Reflect and Refine. He introduced Garry Desire, Carmen Vazquez, Leigh Shaw, Sara Ortiz, and Catherine Shanahan to speak about professional development, curriculum and instruction and how they support the teachers and principals.

Mr. Gaven thanked the board again and asked for any questions or comments.

Margaret Ballantyne stated professional development is near and dear to her. She stated she has never seen a model like this. She thinks the teachers in Mineola are very fortunate to have this kind of a structure.

Christine Napolitano stated she was reflecting over the many years in the district even before she was on the board when she had students attending. There were all different kinds of organizing we had done back then and tonight she said this structure makes the most sense. She stated she was impressed and excited to see where all this is going. She stated the IL's are going in the right direction. She is very excited and thanked them for explaining this structure.

Cheryl Lampasogna stated that as an educator she is jealous because where she works does not have what Mineola has and she also stated she feels very fortunate that her children attend Mineola schools.

Superintendent Comments

Dr. Nagler stated teaching is an incredibly difficult job and try to recognize all the variables involved in appropriate PD for different teachers based on a discipline gets overwhelming. So the mindset really was instead of trying to scramble around and put everyone in their disciplines and then provide discipline based PD, is there a way to flip that. The genesis of this team was to take out the department chairs. We don't

want to organize by subject any more, we want to organize by project based that's good for kids. He stated we are very lucky to have hired very exceptional people. He stated he is incredibly impressed with their work ethic, with their knowledge and with their ability to interact with one another. He said when he sees them in action it really warms his heart. He loved the presentation theme - Recognizing Reflecting and Refining. He was very proud to share the Instructional Leaders with you this evening. He thanked them for coming out tonight to explain to you exactly what they do. He told them to keep doing what they are doing because it is good stuff.

Margaret told everyone to follow the IL's on twitter to see all the good stuff they are doing.

L. Public Comments

Stephanie Datys introduced herself as a strong advocate for students with special needs. She stated she attends PTA meetings and is amazed at the wonderful work being done for neuro-typical kids. She said that Mineola can make some strides in the special education program and asked the board what they think is the greatest challenge the Mineola district has regarding special needs children.

Dr. Nagler stated what he wants for special education students is the same for every child which is for every child to have a wonderful experience at school both socially and academically. And in order to do that, we put systems in place that allow teachers to differentiate work based on children's ability and push children to grow in whatever area is appropriate for them to grow. He stated this is different for every kid whether they are in special education or for the gifted and everyone that falls in between. This is the challenge for every school district. He said he wants every student to have the appropriate experience for them. And in his opinion Mineola does a very good job of this. Ms. Datys had concerns about discipline problems. Dr. Nagler stated we have professionals in the district to handle this. If a teacher needs extra staff to help we will hire the extra staff to help. Ms. Datys spoke about special education children need to know about the extra-curricular activities. Dr. Nagler stated we can do what we can to advertise and make the parents of special education children aware of the extra-curricular activities.
