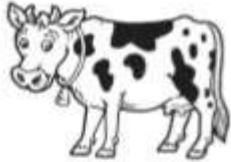

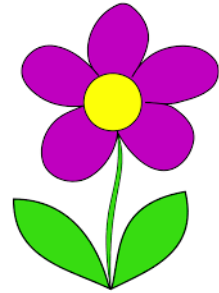

And I can barely feel my feet.



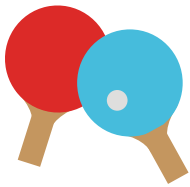
The last is done, the next is here,

Toy Store

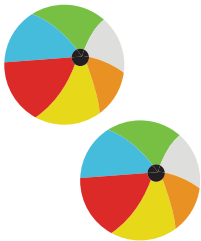
Sally and her friends are at the toy store. Answer each problem about **making change**. Show your work!



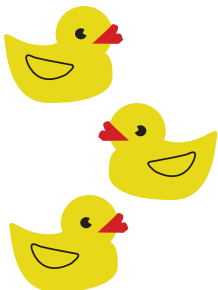
Sally has 65 cents. If she buys a teddy bear for 32 cents, how much change will she get back?
