Multnomah Youth Commission: Applications Now Available

Multnomah County and the City of Portland are happy to announce recruitment for the **2013-14 Multnomah Youth Commission**. Please encourage any young person you know who will be between the ages of 13-21 (on August 1, 2013) to apply by April 29th.

Youth Commissioners serve a one-year term and commit up to 15 hours per month to help advise the County & City on issues that impact the lives of their peers. Youth Commissioners are also in charge of implementing "Our Bill of Rights: Children + Youth," the nation's first Bill of Rights written by and for young people. The Youth Commission gets things done! One young person said it this way,

"I can honestly say I have never seen a group so action- driven. I've seen talk-driven, but never action-driven...The group makes me want to do more. Really! It makes me want to get out into the world, get my hands dirty, and make a difference!" -Ameneh Yasrebi

Youth interested in policy, activism, community organizing, or making the community better can apply to be Youth Commissioners. Here is a current look at the Youth Commission's three committees and their impacts on the community.

EDUCATION/ YOUTH VOICE: The Youth Voice/ Education committee works to ensure the youth in our community are heard. We try our best to understand what youth want from the Multnomah Youth Commission and their elected officials. Our committee works hard to create and/ or change policy recommendations that will better represent community youth. Our work includes creating youth candidate and budget forums, organizing community meetings, and working on larger education policy issues. We are working together with Cradle to Career to help stop chronic absenteeism. This is a problem that will take several years to understand and stop, however our committee is helping the Communities Support Youth Collaborative to infuse youth voice and perspective to make change happen.

SUSTAINABLILITY: The Sustainability Committee is focusing on transit equity and transit access with an emphasis on finding continual funding for YouthPass, the free bus pass for Portland Public Schools high school students. Our dream is to expand YouthPass to all of the other school districts within our County. We have partnered with OPAL (Organizing People, Activating Leaders) and have been working closely with them on our efforts. This past year we have gone through a series of training on Environmental Justice issues as well.

YOUTH AGAINST VIOLENCE: The Youth Against Violence Committee has been working to provide youth input to prevent and stop the violence in our community. During the last two years our main focus has been planning the Youth Summits Against Violence. Our goals are to ensure that local leaders in our community are implementing the policy recommendations we created during the first summit and taking action from the second. We plan to re-apply for the State Farm's Youth Advisory Board Grant to continue our work into the future. We will continue our partnership with school groups and youth community organizations to extend our work. With the policy recommendations on violence, we are providing funding for 14 curriculum-based advocacy service learning projects to take the policies we created and make a lasting difference in our schools.
