Don't forget to register your child for pre-school at one of our local agencies. While Greenville does not have its own preschool, we work with local pre-schools to help students and families make the transition to Kindergarten each year. Preschool is a very important step in a child's development. We have found that children who attend pre-school are more ready – both emotionally and academically – for Kindergarten. This makes a HUGE difference in their ability to adjust to the school environment and to the academics that they will be expected to master by the end of the Kindergarten year.

# **Kids Read Now**

Planning for the Kids Read Now Summer Program is currently underway! Kids Read Now is a non-profit organization that promotes reading to maintain learned skills over the summer. This will help fight that summer slide!
