## **April Break Assignment by the Numbers**

- III. Read a total of <u>three (3) news articles</u> from different reputable, published sources.
  - You choose two (2) news articles to read from two (2) different news sources. These sources need to be from sources that are reputable and published. For example, if you choose to read a news article from Newsday or Newsday.com, then the next article needs to come from a different news source, such as The London Times or The Wall Street Journal.
  - These news articles can be from the same day but must be from different sources.
- II. Post to my BLOG a <u>summary of each</u> news article you read. <u>Both (2) summaries</u> can be in the same BLOG entry.

## YOU MAY NOT USE THE WORD "INTERESTING" IN YOUR SUMMARIES.

- These summaries need to be in your own words to avoid plagiarism.
  - The easiest way to do protect yourself from being accused of plagiarism is to read the article and then put the article away.
  - Next type of a summary of your article <u>from your memory</u>. By putting the article aside, it keeps you from pulling wording from the actual article (plagiarism).
- You need to include a citation at the end of each summary so your classmates can go find the article you read.
  - This citation can be a hyperlink to the webpage with your article.
  - If you read the hard copy of the news article, you need to go to
    <a href="http://www.easybib.com/">http://www.easybib.com/</a> and fill out the information to generate a citation you can then copy and paste into your BLOG entry.
  - One (1) citation for each article  $\mathbf{X}$  two (2) articles = two (2) citations.
- I. Read your classmates' responses. Find **one (1) summary** you would like to read more about and then follow the citation to the entire article.
  - After you have read the entire article your classmate has read and summarized, write a response BLOG entry explaining your feeling on the article.

## The Points:

10 points for each summary posting with citation. No citation, no points.

5 points for a response to a classmate's posting.
