## IOWA STATE ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PROGRESS

Each spring, all 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students must take statewide assessments to measure student proficiency, growth, and readiness indicators. All Iowa schools must give the annual assessment to maintain state accreditation and to fulfill the federal requirement of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). This year, the new Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) has been developed to provide data on student progress toward state-adopted standards in literacy, math and science. At Linn-Mar High School, we will be giving the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress on Monday, April 8, and Tuesday, April 9.

9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grades will take three assessments (Reading, Language and Writing, Math), while 10<sup>th</sup> grade will take four assessments (Reading, Language and Writing, Math, Science). 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be taking the online version of the ISASP, while 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students will be using a more traditional paper/pen-pencil format. For the first time, students will have a writing component, and students should expect the assessment to be challenging.

The change in the state test creates some new scheduling challenges. Thus, **testing this year will be done in the afternoon of April 8, and the morning of April 9 (see schedule)**. The morning of April 8, will be a regular schedule for Periods 1-4/Blocks 1-2. Students will then follow the ISASP Schedule for the afternoon of April 8. 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will not be scheduled during testing, however, study options will be available for students needing or wanting support in current coursework.

## **SEMESTER EXAMS ON JUNE 3, 4 and 5**

Semester exams will run from 8:30 - 3:30 p.m. on June 3, and from 8:30 - 11:45 a.m. on June 4 and June 5. Lunch will be available all three days with busses running at 3:40 p.m. on June 3 and 12:00 p.m. on June 4 and June 5. Students do not have to be on campus during non-exam periods. #### GRADE TRANSCRIPTS

Students can send transcripts to prospective colleges or other post-secondary institutions at any time using Naviance Student. Students needing help in setting up their Naviance Student accounts should see their counselor or stop by either the 9th-10th Grades Office or the 11th-12th Grades Office.

#### **2019-20 STUDENT SCHEDULE DISTRIBUTION**

It is anticipated that student schedules for the 2019-20 school year will be available on Power School by the week of May 6. 8th grade students will be able to view their 9th grade schedules sometime in May as well.

#### POWERSCHOOL LEARNING IN 2019-20

All LMHS courses will be utilizing PowerSchool Learning in 2019-20. Students will be able to interact with the platform and parents will have 'eyes only' access to PowerSchool Learning through a separate parent account. Currently, all 'blended learning' class sections and many LMHS classes are already utilizing PowerSchool Learning during this school year. Five icons (created by LMHS Art teacher Chris Thilges) help guide students when using PowerSchool Learning (see chart on this page) in identifying priority standards to be learned, lessons for learning the priority standards, checks for understanding, assistance for review, rehearsal, or for those struggling to understand the priority standards, and extension experiences for each priority standard.

## **SERIOUS THREAT-INTRUDER DRILL ON APRIL 3**

LMHS will be participating in our second Serious Threat-Intruder evacuation drill on Wednesday, April 3, at 2:00 p.m. An adjusted schedule will be used for this day. The Marion Police Department and the Marion Fire Department will also be participating in the drill. One of our top goals for the year is to evacuate everyone who is able from the building in under one minute.

\*Here is what is posted in each room of the HS next to the postings for Fire and Natural Disaster

#### LOCKDOWN OR SERIOUS THREAT

For a threat within the building: flee the building immediately.

**RUN**—Go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

For announced building lockdown with a threat outside of the school building: stay in the building and listen for instructions.

**HIDE**—Move away from outside, ground level windows and doors. Please, do not use cell phones. At some point, you will be instructed to use your cell phone to contact family and let them know that you are ok. For a threat in your immediate area and you are unable to flee: protect yourself, and flee the building as you are able.

**FIGHT**—If you cannot leave a room, barricade doors, and 'arm' yourself with any objects to use to attack should a perpetrator try to enter the room. As you are able, flee the building, and go by foot to either the ESCO building (on Barrington Ave. north and west of LMHS) or the Indian Creek Country Club (on Indian Creek Road south and east of LMHS) so that you can be accounted for. It does not matter which location.

## CRISISGO! For Parents and Safe2SpeakUp for Students in 2019-20

Currently, LMHS staff have the ability to quickly communicate with building and district administration during any crisis in the school. In 2019-20, students will have the ability to put the Safe2SpeakUp app on their mobile devices if they choose to do so. We are also working to have the app placed on all student-issued computers for next year. This student app will allow students to receive immediate communications from the building during a crisis, and it will also allow for students to communicate with building administrators and school counselors to help prevent a potential crisis as well as communicate with building administrators and school counselors during a crisis on campus. LMHS parents will have 'eyes only' access to the CrisisGo! app. The 'eyes only' access will allow parents to receive immediate communications from the building should a crisis be taking place on campus.

## **Linn-Mar High School Parking Lottery for 2019-20**

LMHS limits the number of issued parking tags to ensure safety access on campus. A \$25.00 tag fee for eligible students guarantees an on-campus parking space for students with parking tags. Students must have a school permit or a valid driver's license in order to enter the lottery.

11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grades: (750 parking tags issued in the North and South Lots)

Lottery will determine choice of two designated parking lots (North and South).

Lottery forms may be turned in **beginning Thursday**, **August 1**, and are due by noon on Friday, August 9. Forms will be available in the office and on the HS website.

Lottery forms must be received by noon on Friday, August 9.

Students will make lot preferences on Lottery sign up form.

Lottery takes place on Monday, August 12, at noon.

Lottery selectees may begin purchasing parking tags on Monday, August 12, after posting of results. \$25.00 for parking tag.

Students must verify a valid driver license at the time of submitting application for the lottery.

10<sup>th</sup> Grade: (140 parking tags issued in the Aquatic Center Lot)

## 9th Grade-Only 1st Day of School at LMHS:

For the third year, LMHS will have a 9<sup>th</sup> Grade-Only 1<sup>st</sup> day of school on Friday, August 23, beginning at 8:30 a.m. 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will use a Homeroom schedule and will report to all classes during the day. Feedback from our first two years has been positive in helping our 9<sup>th</sup> grade students adjust to the high school building prior to all LMHS students reporting to school. 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades will report for the first day of classes on Monday, August 26, at 8:30 a.m. Both August 26 and 27 will use a Homeroom schedule at LMHS.

## Parent Open House is Being Replaced:

A few changes will be taking place for the 2019-20 school year at LMHS. First, the Parent Open House night is being replaced. In an effort to reach more than the roughly ten percent of parents who have attended Parent Open House, each teacher is going to send, via email, short videos with the course information that has traditionally been provided during the open house. It is hoped that a significantly higher percentage of parents will receive the course information through the teacher course videos. Second, in an effort to allow parents to tour the building(s) and to allow students more opportunities to tour the building prior to classes, LMHS will be open for parents and students to walk the building from 7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m. on Monday, August 19, through Thursday, August 22. Entry into the main building will be at both Door #3 (North) and Door #13 (South). Entry into the LRC building to 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor classrooms will be at the 10<sup>th</sup> Street (West) door.

## Student Pictures For 9th, 10th, and 11th Grades:

Student pictures will be taken prior to the school on the LMHS Auditorium Stage beginning Wednesday, August 21, from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and ending on Thursday, August 22, from 11:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Picture retakes and make-ups will be taken on Friday, September 6, from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. It is hoped that these dates and times will allow for flexibility with family and student practice schedules. Student pictures will be done on a drop-in basis with multiple LifeTouch photographers on site.

LMHS will be a 1:1 school next year as all LMHS students will be issued a Hewlitt-Packard computer. 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be issued their computers on August 23, the 9<sup>th</sup> grade-only first day of school. 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grades will be issued their computers during Homeroom on their first day of school, August 26. Guidelines and expectations for the student-issued computers will be sent prior to the school year and given again during distribution. Students will keep their student-issued computers until either the last school day of 12<sup>th</sup> grade or checkout should they leave prior to graduation.

## Four Parent Conference Dates:

We will have four parent conference dates for the 2019-20 school year (September 26, November 21, February 27, and April 23). The September and April dates will prioritize scheduling conferences for students currently struggling or not performing at a proficient level in a particular course. Parent Conferences on September 26 and April 23 will be held from 4:00-7:30 p.m. Parent Conferences on November 21 and February 27 will coincide with a Two-Hour Early Dismissal and be held from 2:00-6:00 p.m.

## Six District Early Release Dates:

Six Two-Hour Early Release Dates will be held district-wide in 2019-20 to allow for more staff Professional Development. The dates of each Two-Hour Early Release are all on Thursdays and school at LMHS will be dismissed at 1:30 p.m. (November 7, 14, 21, and February 27, March 5, March 12).
