As you likely know, we are in the middle of the Montana 68th Regular Legislative Session. This happens every two years, and is how our state legislature introduces new bills for the governor to consider signing into law.

One bill this Session is House Bill 690. HB690 introduces new language intended to further protect the privacy and security of the students of Montana. As such, we here at SRVS are following it closely.

HB690 covers several details of privacy and security. One such detail is the use of facial recognition technology. SRVS uses facial recognition technology with our camera system, and we have done so for some time now. The use of facial recognition technology associated with our security system is vitally important to tracking known and, more importantly, unknown people who come onto school properties.

The leadership team and I take student data privacy very seriously, and we are committed to ensuring that only appropriate school personnel have access to sensitive information, including the camera systems. We work closely with law enforcement as appropriate, and are proud of the work we do together as a community to ensure the safety of our students and faculty. As we track HB690, we will ensure that SRVS remains compliant with Montana law as we continue to extend the safety and data privacy protections that we have always been committed to. At the Montana FIRST TECH Challenge competition held in Bozeman on February 2nd, RedNek Robotics from Sun River won the Inspire Award, earning our way to the 2023 World Championships in Houston, TX April 10th-22nd. The Inspire Award is given to the team who best embodies the 'challenge' of FIRST (*For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology*) and is an ambassador and role model. RedNek Robotics will be in Houston competing against 600 other teams from all around the world.

RedNek Robotics is a robotics and science club located in Sun River, MT. Although the team is based out of Sun River, our six-person team encompasses an area of over 600 square miles, with kids from Great Falls, Cascade, Dearborn, Fairfield, and the Sun River Valley. Since the beginning of the team in 2005, we've won the FTC World Competition three times and placed second twice. Along with robotics, our team does real world engineering and projects to help, teach, and inspire our community. One of our biggest projects, finished in August 2022, was creating a motorized trike for a teen boy with a disability that hinders the mobility of his lower body. For the first time in his life, he could ride his "bike" with his friends. Now comes the challenge of raising a significant amount of money to make the trip. Counselor's Corner Spring 2023

I can't believe we are already into spring! Seems like just a short time ago, we welcomed back students for the new year! Spring is a busy time in both middle and high school, with everyone pushing to get through to that last day!

In the high school, March brings the yearly ACT test for juniors. This year, 31 juniors will participate in this annual assessment on Tuesday, March 28th, at 8:30 AM, in the gymnasium. The ACT test serves two purposes; it provides the district with a measure of progress for the junior students to ensure they are making adequate progress toward graduation and serves as a college admissions test and a tool for college course placement. This year for the first time at Simms High School, the ACT test will be entirely online instead of the traditional paper and pencil format. The students' advantage to taking the test online includes receiving their test scores much faster. With online testing, it is only a matter of a few days before students can access their results; using paper testing, students often wait more than 2 weeks. The online test also provides an on-screen timer and a built-in calculator for students. Earlier in March, a group of junior students participated in a mock administration of the ACT, which tested our network here at the school, as well as students' Chromebooks to make sure online testing would be successful – the mock administration went smoothly with no issues from either side! Seniors should still be on the lookout for scholarships to assist them in paying for their post-secondary plans. Every senior has had access since the 1st day of school to a Google Scholarship classroom that lists multiple scholarship opportunities, and these updates are posted regularly.

A lot of scholarships have deadlines in April; students should be checking their emails for notifications regarding the posting of new scholarships as well as checking for upcoming deadlines. Deadlines for scholarships are hard deadlines, with **NO EXCEP-TIONS**. Anyone attending college in the fall should have their FAFSA completed by now; if that is a step that is still needing completion, you can do that here:

https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa

Some need-based scholarships require completing the FAFSA to even be considered for an award. Remember - just completing the FAFSA does NOT obligate you to take the money offered. You have the option of accepting the aid or not.

Spring is a testing season for other grades as well. The final round of MAP testing begins the week of April 3^{rd} ; students in grades 6-10 are tested in Math, Reading, Language, and Science. Also, in April, the testing window begins for the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). This assessment is given to grades 6-8 to assess student knowledge and skills in English Language Arts/Literacy and Math, as well as to measure growth from the previous year. These tests are completed over a two-week period, April 17th – 27th. Eighth-grade students will also take the State Science Assessment during this twoweek window. With high-stakes testing, please emphasize to your child the importance of getting enough sleep and eating healthy so they can do their best. Graduation is right around the corner! "Senioritis" has hit the halls of Simms High School with a vengeance! Seniors need to continue working hard through the 3rd and 4th quarters and finish out the year strong! Seniors must provide any scholarship information and post-secondary plans to Mrs. Fryberger in the office no later than May 1st for it to be included in the commencement program. This year, seniors will hold their commencement exercises on Sunday, May 21st, at 1 PM in the Simms High School gymnasium. Best Wishes to the Class of 2023!




