


Fourth Quarter Report Cards

As the weather warms up, we are all ready to shed the heavy winter clothes. Tornado Warning



When the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning, it means that an actual tornado has been sighted by a trained spotter or a radar reading shows conditions are right or imminent for a tornado to develop in the immediate area. When a tornado warning isissued for the immediate Janesville area, the emergency sirens will be activated.

Twice each school year, Franklin Middle School practices the response the school would use if an emergency siren is activated for a tornado warning during the school day. Franklin Middle School has designated safe areas for all students and staff to go to when a tornado warning issued.

Because all doors to Franklin Middle School are secure during the school day, they will remain locked during a tornado warning. Staff are not encouraged to respond to door buzzers, knocks on doors, or phone calls, but rather to remain in their designated safe zone until the tornado warning is cancelled. We also encourage parents and family members of students to seek safe shelter during a tornado warning. Parents or family members should not come to Franklin Middle School during a tornado warning to pick up their child.

Once the tornado warning is canceled, Franklin Middle School will return to suual operations. At that time, staff will be able to respond to door buzzers and phone calls. Thank you in advance, for working with Franklin Middle School to keep your child safe during a tornado warning. ARE YOU MOVING?

If you will be moving from your current home address please contact Franklin Middle School's student services center at 608-743-6026, as soon as possible, to determine what paperwork you will need to fill out for your child to continue attending his/her current school. Please note: If you are moving to an address outside of the School



District of Janesville, in most cases, your child is eligible to continue attending the School District of Janesville as long as you complete the appropriate paperwork within the required timeline.

If you have any questions about school placement for a particular address, please contact the Student Services Office for the School District of Janesville at 608-743-5152. The Student Services Office is open year round.

If you are the parent of an elementary student and will be moving over the summer months when the elementary schools are closed, please contact the Students Services Office for the School District of Janesville at 5608-743-5152 or the New Student Enrollment Office at 608-743-5153 to complete the appropriate paperwork.

Public School Open Enrollment Timelines

The State of Wisconsin has announced the application period for open enrollment (also known as public school choice) begins in February for the following school year. Open Enrollment laws permit children to attend a public school in a school district other than the one in which they live.

The open enrollment application period for the **2018-2019** school year is from **February 5**, **2018** – **April 30**, **2018**. Parents are encouraged to apply on-line at <u>https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp</u>. Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction or any school district after **January 15**, **2018** and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district during the application period. Paper applications to attend Janesville must be submitted to the Administrative Services Department no later than 4:00 p.m. on **April 30th** (a postmark does not constitute timely submission). Applications turned in prior to **February 5th** will be returned as not valid and must be resubmitted after **February 5th** but before **April 30th**.

Enrollment in a requested school or program is subject to space and other limitations and is not guaranteed. Transportation is the responsibility of the parent.

Under School District of Janesville board policy, students who attended the district under open enrollment the previous year are not required to reapply for the following school year.

An application is required for each sibling in the family. For example, if a family has one child in elementary school that has been approved for open enrollment and a new student entering kindergarten next year, the student entering kindergarten must apply for open enrollment in order to attend the School District of Janesville.

Parents will be informed in June whether their open enrollment applications have been approved or denied. The student's school or program placement will be provided in June.

Periodo de Inscripción Abierta para las Escuelas Públicas

El Estado de Wisconsin ha anunciado que el periodo de aplicaciones para inscripción abierta (también conocido como preferencia de escuela pública), comienza en febrero para el próximo año escolar. Las leyes de Inscripción Abierta permiten que los niños asistan a una escuela pública en un distrito escolar, fuera del distrito en el que viven.

El periodo de solicitud para Inscripción Abierta para el año escolar 2018-19, es del 5 de febrero y el 30 abril de 2018. Se recomienda que los padres llenen su solicitud por internet en: <u>https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp</u>. Aunque se recomienda la solicitud por internet, pueden obtenerse los formularios de solicitud en el Departamento de Instrucción Pública o en cualquier distrito escolar, después del 15 de enero de 2018 y tienen que entregarse (se recomienda la entrega en persona) al distrito escolar de no residencia, durante el periodo de solicitud. Las solicitudes tienen que entregarse en el Departamento de Servicios Administrativos, antes del las 4:00 p.m. del 30 abril (un sello del correo no constituye la entrega oportuna). Las solicitudes entregadas antes del 5 de febrero, serán devueltas como no válidas y tendrán que ser presentadas de nuevo después del 5 de febrero, pero antes del 30 abril.

La inscripción en un programa o en una escuela que se solicita, está sujeta al espacio y a otras limitaciones y no está garantizada. La transportación es responsabilidad de los padres.

Bajo la política del comité del Distrito Escolar de Janesville, los estudiantes que asistieron al distrito bajo la inscripción abierta el año anterior, no necesitan llenar una solicitud de nuevo para el año escolar siguiente.

Se requiere una solicitud para cada niño en la familia. Por ejemplo, si una familia tiene un niño en la primaria que ha sido aprobado para la inscripción abierta y a un nuevo estudiante entrando al Kínder el próximo año, el estudiante entrando al Kínder tiene que aplicar para la inscripción abierta, para poder asistir al Distrito Escolar de Janesville.

Se les informará a los padres en el mes de Abril, si su solicitud de inscripción abierta ha sido aprobada o rechazada. La colocación en el programa o escuela del estudiante, será notificada en el mes de Mayo.

What Makes a TAG Student?

You may be wondering, "Is my student a TAG student?" High test scores and classroom performance are key components in identifying a student as Talented and Gifted (TAG). When looking to identify a student as TAG, advocates look, over several years, for consistently high scores among a variety of standardized tests sample size is important when looking at test results. TAG Advocates will then speak with teachers to determine if a student has other qualities that make them a TAG student, such as knowledge far above grade-level peers, depth of knowledge in a subject, and the ability to learn new concepts after minimal practice. Even if a students does not qualify as TAG, they still are able to participate in a wide variety of classroom and extra-curricular activities to extend their learning and challenge their mind. Title 1 News

Franklin Middle School is a schoolwide Title 1 School. What does that mean for your child? It means access to highly qualified teachers including a Reading and Math Interventionist to support students in their reading and math classrooms. Title 1 services can include, but are not limited to, extra support in the math and reading classrooms, small group instruction, and targeted interventions. Here at Franklin our Title 1 teachers are shared with Edison Middle School. Mrs. Steele is available at Franklin in the afternoons for reading instruction.
