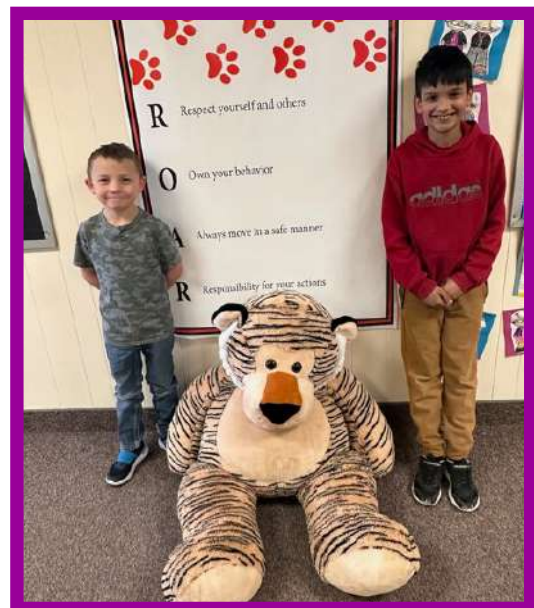

The Simms High School students recently competed in the Regional Science Fair. Additionally, Brylee and Zoey Wright earned First Place overall and Bailey Anderson earned Second Place overall. Due to this placement, Brylee & Zoey Wright and Bailey Anderson earned an all expenses paid trip to the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) being held in Los Angeles, California! This is the second year that Brylee and Zoey Wright have qualified for this pres-

tigious event!

Bailey Anderson is a freshman who is competing at the high school level for the first time this year. This is a very impressive achievement for these students! There are only two projects that qualify from the Regional Science Fair, and four projects that qualify from the State Science Fair, for a total of only six projects from Montana. Simms High School students earned two of the six available projects to qualify for ISEF and they have not yet even competed at the State Science Fair. We are incredibly proud of all the high school students who worked so hard on their projects!

At the same time, Simms Middle School students also competed at the Regional Science Fair. 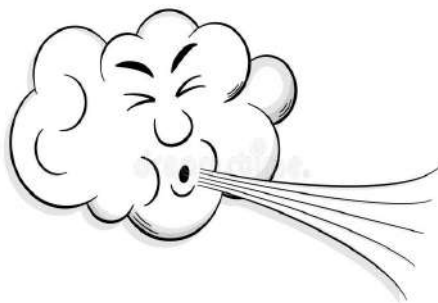

## **Counselor's Corner Spring 2024**

**It's hard to believe how close to the end of the school year it is! With spring comes a lot of activities with our high school and middle school students- one of which is testing!**

**In the high school, the juniors will take the annual state ACT exam on Tuesday, April 16<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 8:30 AM. The ACT test serves two purposes: it provides the district with a measure of progress for the junior students to ensure they are making adequate progress toward graduation and serves as a college admissions test and a tool for college course placement. Last year was the first ACT assessment given at Simms that was completely online; this turned out to be a wonderful change and worked very well for students. With online testing, it's only a few short weeks – possibly days – until students can access their results. The online test also provides an on-screen timer and built-in calculator for students. Once their scores are available, students can provide the colleges of their choice with that information.**

**Senior students have been busy working on scholarship applications. Every senior has had access to the scholarship information since last fall. New scholarship information is posted when it is made available – seniors should be checking the Scholarship and College Info 23-24 Google Classroom regularly for new opportunities. Many scholarship opportunities are also found by doing a simple Google search. March and April are very busy months for scholarships – don't miss out on free money opportunities! College-bound seniors should also be completing their FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to see what aid is available to them to attend college in the fall.**

Some need-based scholarships require FAFSA completion to even be considered for their scholarship. If any student needs assistance filling out their FAFSA, I am happy to help!**

**The middle school also enters testing season in March and April. Starting on March 25<sup>th</sup> and running through April 4<sup>th</sup>, students in grades 6-8 will be taking the annual SBAC assessment (Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium) in their core classes; in addition, the 8<sup>th</sup> grade will take the State Science Assessment. This assessment is given to grades 6-8 to assess student knowledge and skills in English Language Arts/Literacy and Math, as well as to measure growth from the previous year. With such high-stakes testing, please emphasize to your child the importance of getting enough sleep and eating healthy, so they can do their best! Also, please try to keep any absences to a minimum during this testing time if possible. Students who are absent during testing will need to make it up when they return.**

**With graduation right around the corner, “senioritis” has hit the halls of Simms with a vengeance! Seniors need to continue to push through the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and finish out the year strong! Seniors must provide their graduation program insert write-up to Mrs. Fryberger in the office no later than May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Graduation this year is on Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup> at 1 PM in the Simms High School gymnasium.**

## *News from* **REDNEK ROBOTICS**

Sun River Valley Robotics club had a fun season. We hosted the new game announcement on Sept 9th where we also showed previous year's robots. This year's game heavily favored autonomous operation and with the help of programming mentor, Mark Hall, our programming team made autonomous look easy and put our team 724 robot at the top of both qualifier and state tournament seeding rounds. A couple hiccups in the state playoffs cost us the opportunity to travel to Houston in April where there will be approximately 20,000 nerd kids under one roof for 5 days. But one of our team members, Robyn Mathison, will be one of the two Dean's List finalists who will be able to attend. Robyn did a great job with the vision programming, outreach and digital content.

Late in the season, a group of 5th - 8th graders, all from Vaughn and Cascade, formed a team and qualified for the state tournament. They ran well and ended the round robin play in 3rd place out of 27 teams, and chose to be the 3rd seed captain during the playoff rounds. It was really fun to watch them do so well in a high school competition!

We helped with several science fair projects. The kids had good success at the recent regional science fair, and are working on projects that could be developed into useful devices. Among those projects are a saddle blanket to map varying pressures caused by saddles, a thermal deer detector, a DIY hay moisture sensor, DIY metal detector, stock water freeze status monitor, a 7 day live-stock feed/medicine dispenser, GPS cow locator, a couple water system monitors, and a soil analysis to determine if hemp might grow.

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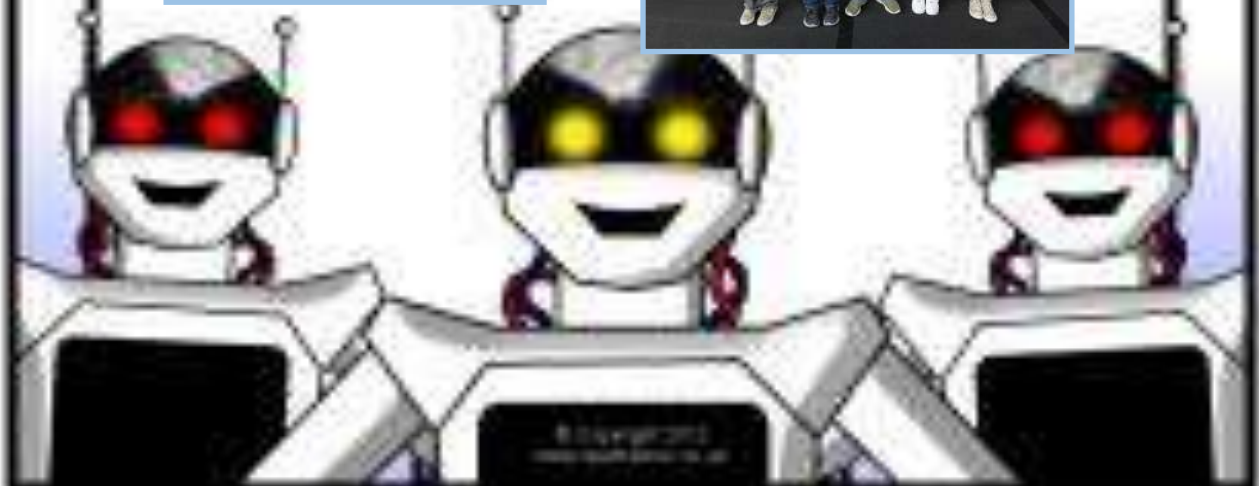
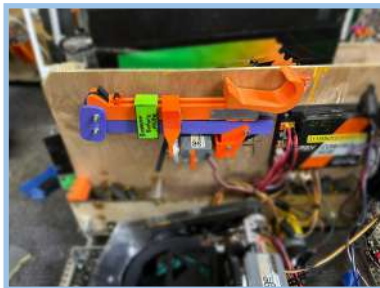

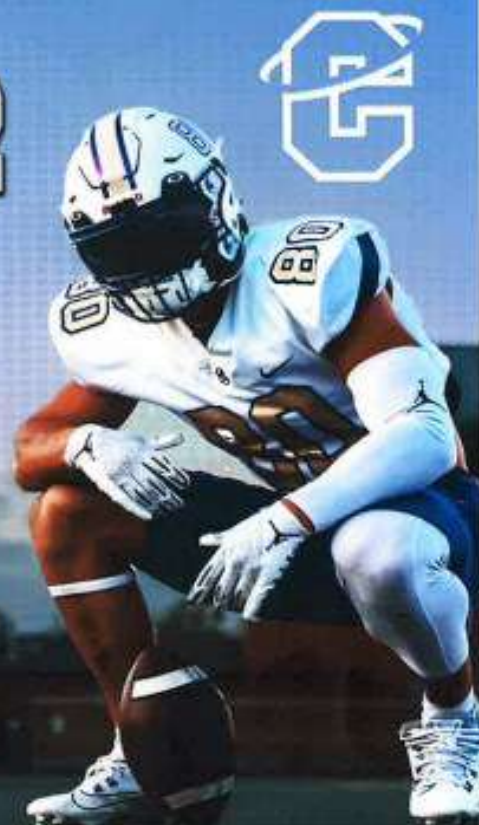
