Dear Hanlon Families,

As I was helping my daughter study for her math test last week, I heard her say the words that every parent dreads, “I can’t get this. I’m no good at math.” I was tempted to draw her into a hug and tell her how smart she is, but I stopped myself. This was a teachable moment happening right at our kitchen island.

Dr. Carol Dweck, researcher and author of *Mindset*, explains that there are two distinctly different viewpoints or mindsets that develop in people. Some people have a “fixed mindset,” believing that intelligence and ability are predetermined. You’re either born smart or you’re not.

People with a “growth mindset” believe that intelligence, ability, and performance are based on effort and using effective strategies. They believe that hard work and perseverance can help you ace that test. As we prepare children for the path of life, a growth mindset is both preferable and an indicator of future success in life.

So how do we help our children to develop a growth mindset? Dr. Dweck urges parents to be thoughtful around praise with children. When we respond to our child’s success with phrases like, “You’re so smart!” or “You’re really good at math,” we may be unintentionally setting them up for disappointment when they fail, which is bound to happen someday. While those responses seem positive and supportive, we are actually sending a message that the test score is something they have no control over. Down the road, when the child gets a low score on a test, she may question her intelligence. “Does this poor grade mean I’m not smart?”

Dweck tells us to praise effort instead. When the child comes home with a good score, saying something like, “Wow! All that hard work, studying, and perseverance really paid off! I’m proud of you!” By praising effort, we are teaching our children that they have influence over the challenges they face in life. Their path is not

predetermined. When they get a low score, the children with a “growth mindset” are able to attribute the score to insufficient effort or ineffective strategy. They are better able to see that failure as a challenge, and make a plan for renewed effort or a different strategy next time.

So as I watched my eleven year old facing off against her challenging math homework, I drew her in for a big hug and said, “I know this feels hard right now, but you are a problem solver. You’ve been working hard tonight and I’m so proud of you. You’re not going to let these decimals get you down. Let’s keep at it.” I’m sure we will have hundreds, if not thousands, of opportunities to help our children develop a growth mindset throughout their school years. Each one is a teachable moment. Safety Drills

On Thursday, we practiced our first fire drill. Students were well prepared by their teachers, and the entire building was evacuated safely and quickly. We will practice fire drills and lockdown drills for all K-5 students several times this year.

Early Release Wednesdays

Next week we will have our first Early Release Wednesday. All students will be dismissed at 11:50AM. Early Release Wednesdays are an essential part of ensuring that Westwood teachers are kept up to date on the latest educational practices and resources. This year the district's Professional Development Goals will focus primarily on Social and Emotional Learning, and Earth and Space Science. Hanlon teachers will spend this first afternoon learning about Cultural Proficiency and engaging in conversations about race and diversity. Our presenter will be Dr. Carroll Blake, Executive Director of the Achievement Gap for the Boston Public Schools Central Administration. He's been a principal in Wellesley and Roxbury, the METCO director in Lincoln and he is the co-founder of Empowering Multicultural Initiatives. Lunch Cards

All students are provided with a lunch card beginning in Kindergarten. Families who choose to use the school lunch program can set up their child's lunch account using the MySchoolBucks website linked through the district page. For students who don't regularly purchase lunch, the cards can be used "in a pinch" on days that they forget to bring a lunch, and a bill will appear on a monthly statement. Parents and guardians are responsible for communicating lunch plans to their children. There have been occasions when the school lunch looks more enticing than what was sent from home, and children decide on their own to use their card buy lunch. Teachers do not eat with students and the lunch staff does not usually know about individual family preferences as to whether or not they want their child to buy lunch. This can lead to a surprise charge when the bill arrives at home! Some families may decide that they do not want their children to have access to the lunch card at all, so that their children do not make unapproved lunch purchases. If this is the case, please email your child's teacher and ask them to remove your child's card from circulation. We cannot remove cards on a day by day basis, so removal of the card is an "all or nothing" option. Feel free to contact Mrs. Cronin at scronin@westwood.k12.ma.us if you have any questions.
