POLYMER CLAY BEADS

Week 1:

Included with your sketchbook is a bag of materials you will need to make polymer clay beads which will then be baked hard in the oven and later strung into a bracelet or jewelry. These could make great gifts for any upcoming birthdays or holidays (cough-cough *Mother's day* cough-cough!)

Included in the Bag:

Either Black or White clay
2 other colors of clay (I tried to send you a color I think you will like!)

Toothpick
Elastic string
Variety of beads

You will need at home:

Scrap paper to roll the clay on
Oven and cookie sheet to bake the beads (I recommend putting down parchment paper)
Something to cut with (a credit card, ID, or butter knife)

I know it's tempting to dive in right now, but wait until Monday March 30th and there will be a video sent out by email and posted to social media with instructions on how to manipulate the clay and roll the beads. Ask you parents for help to access the video!

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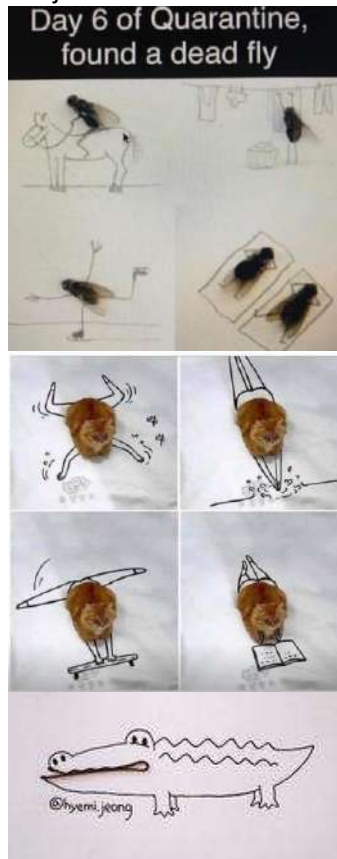
BRINGING THINGS TO LIFE!

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FINDING ART IN NATURE

Week 4: Choose an activity from below

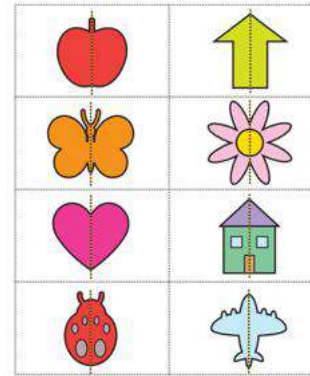
Gather rocks and sticks in the yard to create a face using the natural objects. Take a picture or glue to the page.



Gather rocks, sticks, and leaves around your yard and incorporate them in your artwork!



Symmetry is when an object looks the exact same on one side as the other. To see if an object is symmetrical, you draw a line of symmetry or a line dividing an object to show a perfect match on each side. It's like making a mirror image.



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FOUND OBJECTS

Week 5: Choose an activity from below

Find objects from around the house and organize them to make a color wheel!



Grab a plate and objects from around the house to build a portrait!



Make a homemade Mr. Potato head. It doesn't have to be a potato! Grab anything and use found objects to give it eyes, arms, legs, mouth, hat, etc!



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GETTING OUTSIDE

Week 6: Choose an activity from below

Grab some sidewalk chalk and get outside. If you don't have a sidewalk or paved driveway, ask a parent if you can go somewhere that does like the schools or main street. A parent should stay with you!



Texture rubbings. Go outside with either a blank paper, or a very simple drawing with LARGE shapes and do a texture rubbing with paperless crayons. You can even do texture rubbings with foil and your finger!



Draw outside! Grab a flat surface like a book and your sketchbook and go find something outside to draw. In France, they call this "En Plein Air" and it was very popular in the Impressionism movements. Draw the nature around you as you see it.



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3D WEEK!

Week 7: Choose an activity from below

Create a 3D room! A video of instructions will be posted Monday May 11th. You will need a square piece of paper, any size, but the bigger the better! Scissors, glue, and supplies to draw and color with!

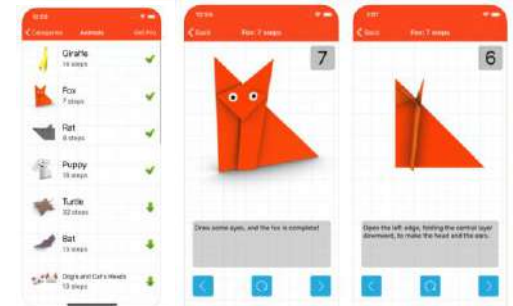
Make a foil sculpture. Use only foil, so you need to problem solve how to attach parts if you make them separate of each other. You can color with sharpie, but wait for sharpie to dry before you touch it!



Ask you parent to help you download the How to Make Origami app to a tablet or phone (not sure about chromebooks?) Use the app for step by step instructions to make lots of different origami sculptures! Always start with a SQUARE piece of paper. Doesn't matter how big, only that it is square! This app even shows the folding actions in motion, very helpful.
