Principal's words



Notes About Renew the Arts

Newark Public Schools Renew the Arts Initiative was established in 2013 to explore and pilot strategies that ensure all students are receiving rigorous sequential arts programming and exposure to high quality community arts experiences. Findings from this initiative help inform a larger, district wide arts education strategy to support the following two goals: i) To expand NPS students' access to rigorous, sequential arts programming in multiple art forms, and ii) To ensure all NPS students have exposure to high quality arts experiences in the community. To date, Sussex Renew has been one of the first and last schools to receive funding from this initiative which has fostered a systemic integration of Arts throughout our school.

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Artists in Residency

Mosaic at Sussex Avenue Renew School

This year the 6th and 8th graders are working with resident artist Kit Sailer to create a glass tile mosaic mural. The students have been working on the mosaic since October. They began their artistic endeavor with a field trip to the Newark Museum to become inspired by examples of mosaics and public art.

Working with music as their theme, the students met with visiting artist Mike “President” Philson to write raps. Images described in the raps were used to generate drawings, and key lines were excerpted to include in the mosaic as text. Each class organized their drawings within larger musical shapes; a microphone, a music note, a piano lid; to create an energetic and colorful design.

Luminous glass tiles are being used for this mosaic. Their grainy texture make them easy cut and safe to handle. The process requires patience and concentration, and the students have worked hard to master this art form.

The mosaic mural is almost done. It will be installed outside in the playground later in the spring when the temperature warms.

This project is made possible through an Artist-in-Education Grant from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts. This is the third year that Sussex Avenue Renew School has received the grant. We thank them for this opportunity and their incredible support.
