# **Registration and General Information**

### **Membership Requirement**

Your family must be a member of the 2013-14 Edgewood PTA in order for your child(ren) to enroll in a club.

## Registration

Registration begins on August 28, 2013 and ends September 13, 2013.

No refund will be made after a club has begun.

### **Company Plan Reimbursement**

If your company has a benefit plan that will reimburse you for the club fee, it is your responsibility to keep a copy of the registration form for this purpose. There is no other form that can be provided.

### **Enrollment Policy**

The size of each club is limited and is based on the instructor's request, safety and room/equipment capacity. For a club that is oversubscribed, enrollment will be determined by lottery.

If a minimum number of students is not met to successfully run a particular club, we may cancel that club. Refunds will be given only in the event that a course is cancelled.

You will be notified by telephone <u>only</u> if your child <u>does not</u> get into a club. If you do not hear from a committee member, it is safe to assume that your child is enrolled in the club of his or her choice. Your child's teacher will receive a list of all students and the clubs for which they are registered.

### **Attendance**

Attendance will be taken in the clubs. If your child attends school during the day, but plans to leave early and/or not attend a scheduled club, please call 721-2704 and leave a message for the ASC Chaperones. If the Chaperone has not been made aware of a child's planned absence from a club, he/she will call two phone numbers provided at the time of registration for parental notification purposes. Please note that the school nurse leaves at 3 p.m. and her office is locked. No one is able to access medication or files after 3 p.m. Any child old enough to self-medicate must submit a "self medicating release form" signed by his/her physician and carry his/her medication. Children who are unable to self medicate must have a parent or caretaker available to assist them in case of an emergency. In an emergency the chaperones or instructors will notify the parents and call 911. Please make sure we have updated emergency contact information on your ASC registration.

Finally, please be aware that if your child's club does not meet until 4:15 p.m., you are responsible for your child between 3:00 p.m. and 4:15 p.m. Children not enrolled in a 3:10 p.m. club are not allowed to stay in the school until their 4:15 p.m. club begins. If this needs to happen, consider signing up for the **Homework Helper** club, which is offered Monday and Thursday at 3:10 p.m. **Note that Homework Helper is open to everyone in Grades 2 to 5.** 

### **Behavior**

For the safety and enjoyment of all, it is the policy of the After School Clubs to remove any child whose behavior is inappropriate, disruptive or who presents a danger to the welfare of others in the club in which they are enrolled. Instructors have been advised to have chaperones notify the child's parents once this occurs. A second occurrence will require the child to be withdrawn from attending the ASC for the remainder of the semester. Without exception, refunds will not be given if a child is removed for disruptive behavior.

### **Pick Up and Drop Off**

A chaperone will escort the kindergarten students to the gymnasium where all the children will gather before their class and their respective instructors will come and bring them to their ASC classroom.

Prompt pick-up of your children is very important. The club instructors are only responsible for teaching during the class period. It is the parents' responsibility to pick up their children on time. It is recommended that you instruct your children to stay in the building if you are delayed. Once they are outside the building, it will be difficult for them to re-enter. Also please remember that the crossing guards are NOT on duty when clubs let out. After 3:15 p.m., the only door unlocked will be at the traffic circle near the gym. If you need to enter the building after this time, you must use this door.

### **Cancellations**

In the event of an unforeseen club cancellation (instructor illness, etc.) every effort will be made to contact parents and to schedule a make-up class. If time allows, scheduling changes will be send out in an <u>E-Blast</u>. It is the parents' responsibility to check for this information.

### **Inclement Weather**

If the Superintendent of Schools determines that the weather is poor enough to cancel all after school programs and activities, this information will be shared in the message from the District's Emergency Notification System. You will not receive a separate call from a member of the ASC committee. If you are out of the house on a day when there is foul weather, PLEASE check your answering machine and emails frequently during the day. If clubs are cancelled, there will be no chaperones on duty to watch a child who has not been picked up when school closes.

### **Allergies**

Due to the high number of food allergies, no food can be eaten by children nor distributed by instructors during the class.

### **Chaperones**

Mr. Frank Fodero, Mrs. Sue Keller and Mrs. Mae Cestaro will be responsible for security in the building and handling emergencies while the clubs are in session. They can be reached on 721-2704.
