Note: This partial list assists in the consideration of AT for the development, review, or revision of a person's educational program, providing some tools and strategies that teams might want to investigate as possible AT solutions. Context notes are crucial, such as location of use (i.e., home, school, community), times of use (or discontinuation reasons), review of AT already in place, and so on.
