Multicultural and Nonsexist Equity Education Opportunity

Chapter 103

Notice: Corporal Punishment, Restraint, and Physical Confinement and Detention

State law forbids school employees from using corporal punishment against any student. Certain actions by school employees are not considered corporal punishment. Additionally, school employees may use "reasonable and necessary force, not designed or intended to cause pain" to do certain things, such as prevent harm to persons or property.

State law also places limits school employees' abilities to restrain or confine and detain any student. The law limits why, how, where, and for how long a

school employee may restrain or confine and detain a child. If a child is restrained or confined and detained, the school must maintain documentation and must provide certain types of notice to the child's parent.

Special Needs Services

Additional support services are available to assist teachers and families when concerns arise with students. These services include our building staff (special education teacher, counselor, nurse, etc.) and Grant Wood Area Education Agency staff (psychologist, social worker, consultant, speech-language pathologist, occupational and physical therapist, work experience coordinators, etc.)

Teachers and families may use input on an informal basis or request formal assistance in identifying strategies to address a concern, in carrying out these strategies, or in monitoring individual student progress. These services are available for all students by teacher or parent request through the counselor at the student's school.

Open Enrollment Date Deadlines

There have been changes to the state regulations on open enrollment requests from parents. Parents of children who they are requesting to be open enrolled out of the school district must notify the sending and receiving district no later than March 1st of the school year preceding the first year desired for open enrollment. Parents of children who will begin kindergarten in the school district are exempt from the March 1st deadline. Parents of children who will begin kindergarten must file by September 1st. Open enrollment papers are on file at the district administrative office.

E-registration in PowerSchool will be available July 25th for parents to complete. Information and forms are available on the school's website www.iowa-valley.k12.ia.us.

All 9th – 12th grade students and parents are required to attend one of the mini-sessions held on August 8th, August 15th or August 22nd. 1:1 Device Requirements for 9th – 12th grade include: a parent must accompany student to mini-session, e-registration must be completed, you must have fees/fines paid to take Device home from school, and student must have 1:1 Device agreement signed in PowerSchool. 1:1 Device Requirements for 6th – 8th grade include: e-registration must be completed, you must have fees/fines paid to take Device home from school, and student must have 1:1 Device agreement signed in PowerSchool. Online payments for meal accounts, fines, and fees can be made at www.PayForIt.net.
