Do I need to use RDS?

- ✓ Any student applying for admission, readmission or transfer to a state supported college or university and claiming residency must use RDS for residency determination.
- ✓ Students applying to, or enrolled at, a North Carolina Independent College or University who want a North Carolina state grant must use RDS for residency determination.

October 15th – 19th

North Carolina's annual campaign to support college access is moving to the month of October this year and is now named NC Countdown to College. Activities during the month support high school seniors in completing three important college enrollment steps: residency, FAFSA, and applications. College Application Week will take place October 15th – 19th. During this week, volunteers at hundreds of NC high schools help students submit online applications for admission while some colleges offer application fee waiver opportunities.

Scholarships are gifts of money that do not require repayment. Scholarships usually recognize special achievements in academics, talent, and leadership. Some scholarships may also require that students demonstrate financial need. Financial need will be determined by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). **The new FAFSA opens October 1st** www.fafsa.ed.gov

Scholarship Tips

Before you start any scholarship applications, it's important to know basic information about the scholarships you are applying for. Common requirements for many (not all) scholarships include: a completed Application, Letters of Recommendation, Essay (s), a copy of your Transcript, and your GPA and SAT/ACT scores.

Tips to remember:

- 1. Apply only if you are eligible.
- Complete the application in full and follow directions.
- 3. Neatness counts. Recommended to submit typed applications.
- 4. Give concrete examples to essay questions.
- 5. Identify the sponsor's goals.

- 6. Write an accomplishments resume.
- 7. Watch all deadlines
- 8. Take steps to make sure your application gets where it needs to go.
- 9. Ask for help if you need it.
- 10. Remember your scholarship application represents YOU!

Scholarship Scams

There are many legitimate scholarship resources available for students and families. Unfortunately, there are also numerous scholarship scams. We encourage all students and parents to learn more from the Federal Trade Commission about common scholarship scams. By becoming aware of the strategies and techniques used, you can learn how to protect yourself and identify potential pitfalls during your scholarship search.

Local Scholarships



Approximately thirty renewable scholarships (ranging from \$1,500 to full tuition, fees, room and board) are offered annually to entering freshmen. Blue & Gold Scholarship recipients are chosen primarily on the basis of superior scholastic and personal achievement and potential. Successful candidates generally present a minimum SAT score of 1200 (critical reading and math) or an ACT score of 27, and a minimum high school GPA of 3.5. (No separate scholarship application).

Scholarship funds for tuition are distributed incrementally, with \$3,500.00 distributed in the first year, \$4,500.00 distributed in the second year, and \$6,000.00 distributed in each of the last two years, as long as eligibility requirements are maintained.
