CAMP WHITEFORD

Summer is usually a quiet time in our school buildings, but not this summer. This summer the halls were filled with giggles, scampering little feet, scissors cutting, singing, reading (in English and Spanish), measuring and drawing on the blacktop, scavenger hunts, investigations, and so much more. Our eight-week Camp Whiteford program was in full swing, and we couldn't have been happier. The sessions offered were two or three weeks in length and covered a variety of topics. Elementary students were engaging their brains through fun activities in word exploration, creative writing, math challenges, book clubs, Spanish, art, and a let's get moving class. Middle school students were in the shop building birdhouses and other creations – but more importantly, learning how to use the tools safely and correctly. They were challenged with math puzzles, games, and brain teasers, played a Spanish version of survivor, learned about Vikings, had a mock trial, and participated in a book club. The camp began on June 21 and ran through August 12, three days a week. There was a two-hour session in the morning, lunch/recess time, and

then a two-hour session in the afternoon ending at 1:45pm. One of my favorite times of the day was watching all the students, kindergarten through 8th grade, interact together at lunch. There were new friendships forged and positive role models being displayed for our younger children. The enthusiasm, energy, and excitement in the building from students and teachers was a wonderful thing to see during these usually quiet summer months!

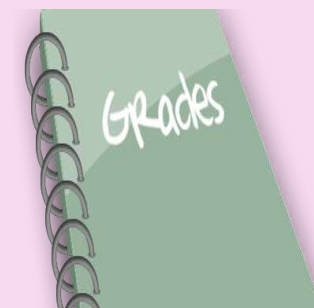

I have concluded that one of the greatest aspects of our school district is how welcoming our students are to others. When new students enroll, they are generally paired up with a "Bobcat Buddy" for a day or two to help support their transition to new routines. However, it typically does not take long and suddenly there will be other students reaching out to help, learn about, and welcome the new students. Whiteford is a unique and special place because of the accepting culture that exists here in our halls. Students are encouraged to participate in a variety of activities within academics, the arts, and athletics. They are not stigmatized if they have a strong passion in one particular area; instead, they are celebrated.

Soon, as we start the new school year, we will see some new faces that will become part of our Bobcat family. I look forward to meeting and welcoming these students and their families and to learn about their talents and passions they will soon be sharing with us.



ANNUAL NOTICES

AHERA—ASBESTOS: As required by the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), this is inform you that the documentation for our District Asbestos Management Plan, the semiannual surveillance inspections (continued monitoring of remaining floor tile in our buildings) and the three-year reinspection are available for your review in the Superintendent's Office. Information regarding response actions may also be found in the District Asbestos Management Plan.

CONCEALED WEAPONS: State law establishes a "Weapon-Free School Zone" that extends 1,000 feet from the boundary of any school property.

The term "weapon" means any object which, in the manner in which it is used, is intended to be used, or is represented, is capable of inflicting serious bodily harm or property damage, as well as endangering the health and safety of persons. Weapons include, but are not limited to, firearms, guns of any type, including air and gas-powered guns (whether loaded or unloaded), knives, razors, clubs, electric weapons, metallic knuckles, martial arts weapons, ammunition, and explosives.

As a School District, we have policies prohibiting the possession of weapons on school property, inside school buildings, and at school events. Obviously, weapons are not appropriate in a school environment.

These restrictions shall not apply in the following circumstances to persons who are properly licensed to carry a concealed weapon:

- A. A parent or legal guardian of a student of the school may carry a concealed weapon while in a vehicle on school property if s/he is dropping off or picking up the student from the school, and any person may carry a concealed weapon solely in the parking lot.
- B. A county corrections officer, a member of a sheriff's posse, a police or sheriff's reserve or auxiliary officer, a State Department of Corrections parole or corrections officer, a private investigator, a Michigan State Police motor carrier officer or capitol security officer, a state court judge, a security officer required by the employer to carry a concealed weapon while on the premises, a court officer, a parole, probation, or corrections officer or absconder recovery unit member of the Department of Corrections if that individual has obtained a Michigan D of C weapons permit.
- C. Retirees of the abovementioned law officials with the same proper training and weapons permits with the exception of retired sheriff's posse or reserve auxiliary officers and retired security officer.

These are very limited exceptions and do not change the district policy that firearms, pistols, and other dangerous weapons are prohibited on school property. Parents and legal guardians are strongly discouraged from bringing concealed weapons on school property even while in a vehicle for pick-up or drop-off of their student. We urge those individuals authorized to carry a weapon to refrain from doing so while in a vehicle on school grounds or while attending a school sponsored event in respect for the safety of our students.

PETS ON DISTRICT GROUNDS: Students play and conduct class and athletic practices on district grounds on a regular basis. Please help us keep our grounds clean and clear of pet debris by not bringing your pet on the district's grounds. ALL animals (except service animals) are prohibited from being on school property unless approved by the administration.

SCHOOL ZONES: Parents, student drivers and district residents are reminded of the reduced speed (25 mph) in posted "School Zones" on Consear and Sylvania-Petersburg Roads. The reduced speed is in effect from 7:30 AM—8:30 AM and 2:30 PM—3:30 PM. Fines are DOUBLED in these designated areas. To ensure the safety of our children and those approaching the district buildings, please adhere to these speed limits.

USE OF TOBACCO ON SCHOOL PREMISES: In compliance with P.A. 140 of 1993, no person at anytime shall smoke, chew, or otherwise use tobacco products, of any kind, in any school building, at school sponsored events, on School District property, on property under the control of the School District, nor in School District vehicles. This policy is in effect twenty-four (24) hours a day, 365 days a year.

WATER QUALITY COMPLIANCE SUMMARY: Due to amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act, 1976 PA 399, K-12 schools and day care facilities that are non-transient, non-community water supplies are required to prepare and make available for inspection an annual water quality report from the previous calendar year.

FOOD SERVICE FAQs

Whiteford Agricultural Schools will be participating in the Seamless Summer Option as part of the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs for the 2021-2022 school year. **THE GREAT NEWS IS that all students enrolled at our school can receive a healthy breakfast and lunch each day at NO CHARGE to your household. We still need your household to complete the Free and Reduced-Priced Meal Application . It is easiest to complete the application via LUNCHAPP.COM which can be accessed from the district's website on the Food Service page. If unable to submit via LUNCHAPP.COM, please complete the paper application and return it to the school district as soon as possible.**

Where can I find the monthly menus? Where can I find an application for Free/Reduced Price Meals? Families are encouraged to annually submit applications for free or reduced priced meals—this includes breakfast and lunch. A paper copy of the application is also available by contacting your child's respective building office.

What is the Meal Magic® Point of Sale System? Whiteford Schools utilizes a computerized sale system for breakfast and lunch sales, which greatly benefits students, parents and staff alike. Each student has their own account and funds stay with the student until they graduate or leave the district. The most efficient use of the Meal Magic® POS system is to put money on your child's account on a regular basis to insure sufficient funds are available for all meal sales. Meal Magic deposit envelopes are available near each building office.

What happens if my child has a negative balance on their account? Students will be provided an alternate meal that meets all established dietary requirements should they not have adequate funds to purchase a meal for the day; however, parents should note that they are responsible for the cost of any alternate meals provided to their child(ren). Balances must be paid in full as soon as possible.

How do I know if my child is in the negative or has a low balance? Automatic notifications are sent to the email address of the primary contact of the student twice weekly (Wednesday and Saturday evenings) for students whose balance falls below \$5.00. You can also view account balances 24/7 at mealmagic.whiteford.k12.mi.us/mealmagic/mylunchaccount.
