SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE...

Dear Whiteford Families,

Greetings! As the 2022-2023 school year quickly approaches, I hope that everyone has enjoyed their summer, and excitement is beginning to build in anticipation of a new school year!

At Whiteford, our VISION is to develop value-driven leaders and critical thinkers who will positively impact their community. It is our MISSION and belief that everyone has the ability to be successful by creating an environment that is physically and emotionally safe, hiring and retaining a highly qualified and dedicated staff, and promoting student success through community support.

In order to meet our VISION and MISSION, we have committed to adding additional resources at both the elementary and secondary schools to strengthen our Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS). MTSS is a framework that provides layered support to better meet the needs of ALL students. This is a whole-district continuous improvement framework designed to maximize all student outcomes both academically and behaviorally. We recognize that teachers and support staff across our district provide robust and impactful instruction to all students, as well as additional support to students who indicate they need it. We seek to harness this process so that we are working in concert to identify students who continually need additional support, and ensure we as a district are placing resources and personnel where they will make the most impact. Based upon our new Strategic Plan, which was created this past spring and outlines our Vision and Mission, we have intentionally allocated financial resources through the hiring of new staff to directly support all students at both the elementary and secondary levels.

Research shows that early intervention and support is key to a child's success. At the elementary level, we currently have a Reading Academic Interventionist (Shelly DeVantier) that supports students who are falling behind with reading skills. This year, through the use of ESSER III grant money, we have added a Math Academic Interventionist (Linda Groch) that will support students who are lagging with mathematical concepts. Also, with ESSER III grant money, we were able to hire a Behavior Interventionist (Mariann Hillard) that will support all students by focusing on strengthening our School-Wide Positive Behavior Interventions of Support (SWPBIS). This is a three-tiered approach that will support all students and staff, and quickly remediate and support students who are struggling to regulate behavior. We will continue to have a full-time counselor, two special education resource teachers, and our enrichment program, C.L.A.W.S., as a comprehensive plan of support.

At the secondary level, we have added a Reading/Math Academic Interventionist (Missy Haley) that will support students who are falling behind with reading and mathematics skills. A part-time mathematics teacher, Brian VanAlstine, will also help those students struggling in the area of math. These positions were also partially-funded with the additional ESSER III grant money. We continue to have a full-time counselor and three special education resource teachers.

Overall, we are excited about the opportunities that are in store for our students and staff for the 2022-2023 school year. We are grateful for the support of our families and community, and we understand that we cannot do this successfully without the support of everyone. Remember, we are better together, we are Whiteford! Have a great year, Bobcats!

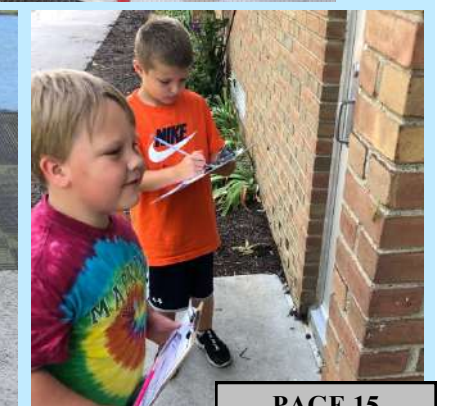
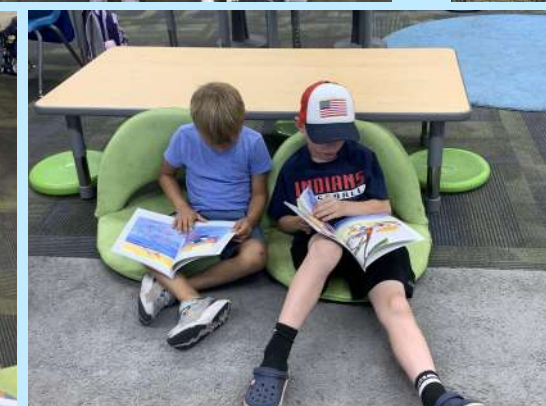
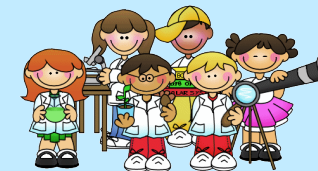
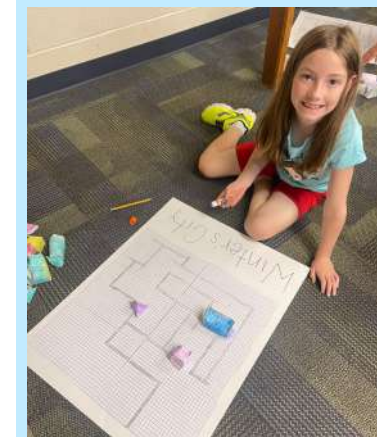
CAMP WHITEFORD

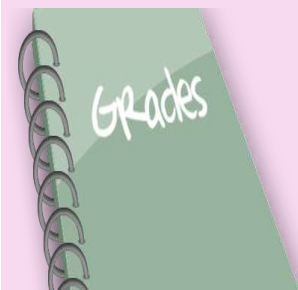

ANNUAL NOTICES

AHERA—ASBESTOS: As required by the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), this is inform you that the documentation for our District Asbestos Management Plan, the semiannual surveillance inspections (continued monitoring of remaining floor tile in our buildings) and the three-year reinspection are available for your review in the Superintendent’s Office. Information regarding response actions may also be found in the District Asbestos Management Plan.

CONCEALED WEAPONS: State law establishes a “Weapon-Free School Zone” that extends 1,000 feet from the boundary of any school property.

The term "weapon" means any object which, in the manner in which it is used, is intended to be used, or is represented, is capable of inflicting serious bodily harm or property damage, as well as endangering the health and safety of persons. Weapons include, but are not limited to, firearms, guns of any type, including air and gas-powered guns (whether loaded or unloaded), knives, razors, clubs, electric weapons, metallic knuckles, martial arts weapons, ammunition, and explosives.

As a School District, we have policies prohibiting the possession of weapons on school property, inside school buildings, and at school events. Obviously, weapons are not appropriate in a school environment.

These restrictions shall not apply in the following circumstances to persons who are properly licensed to carry a concealed weapon:

- A. A parent or legal guardian of a student of the school may carry a concealed weapon while in a vehicle on school property if s/he is dropping off or picking up the student from the school, and any person may carry a concealed weapon solely in the parking lot.
- B. A county corrections officer, a member of a sheriff's posse, a police or sheriff's reserve or auxiliary officer, a State Department of Corrections parole or corrections officer, a private investigator, a Michigan State Police motor carrier officer or capitol security officer, a state court judge, a security officer required by the employer to carry a concealed weapon while on the premises, a court officer, a parole, probation, or corrections officer or absconder recovery unit member of the Department of Corrections if that individual has obtained a Michigan D of C weapons permit.
- C. Retirees of the abovementioned law officials with the same proper training and weapons permits with the exception of retired sheriff's posse or reserve auxiliary officers and retired security officer.

These are very limited exceptions and do not change the district policy that firearms, pistols, and other dangerous weapons are prohibited on school property. Parents and legal guardians are strongly discouraged from bringing concealed weapons on school property even while in a vehicle for pick-up or drop-off of their student. We urge those individuals authorized to carry a weapon to refrain from doing so while in a vehicle on school grounds or while attending a school sponsored event in respect for the safety of our students.

PETS ON DISTRICT GROUNDS: Students play and conduct class and athletic practices on district grounds on a regular basis. Please help us keep our grounds clean and clear of pet debris by not bringing your pet on the district's grounds. ALL animals (except service animals) are prohibited from being on school property unless approved by the administration.

SCHOOL ZONES: Parents, student drivers and district residents are reminded of the reduced speed (25 mph) in posted “School Zones” on Consear and Sylvania-Petersburg Roads. The reduced speed is in effect from 7:30 AM—8:30 AM and 2:30 PM—3:30 PM. Fines are DOUBLED in these designated areas. To ensure the safety of our children and those approaching the district buildings, please adhere to these speed limits.

USE OF TOBACCO ON SCHOOL PREMISES: In compliance with P.A. 140 of 1993, no person at anytime shall smoke, chew, or otherwise use tobacco products, of any kind, in any school building, at school sponsored events, on School District property, on property under the control of the School District, nor in School District vehicles. This policy is in effect twenty-four (24) hours a day, 365 days a year.

WATER QUALITY COMPLIANCE SUMMARY: Due to amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act, 1976 PA 399, K-12 schools and day care facilities that are non-transient, non-community water supplies are required to prepare and make available for inspection an annual water quality report from the previous calendar year.

A paper copy of the application is also available by contacting your child's respective building office.

What is the Meal Magic® Point of Sale System? Whiteford Schools utilizes a computerized sale system for breakfast and lunch sales, which greatly benefits students, parents, and staff alike. Each student has their own account, and funds stay with the student until they graduate or leave the district. The most efficient use of the Meal Magic® POS system is to put money on your child's account on a regular basis to ensure sufficient funds are available for all meal sales. Meal Magic deposit envelopes are available near each building office.

What happens if my child has a negative balance on their account? Students will be provided an alternate meal that meets all established dietary requirements should they not have adequate funds to purchase a meal for the day; however, parents should note that they are responsible for the cost of any alternate meals provided to their child(ren). Balances must be paid in full as soon as possible.

How do I know if my child is in the negative or has a low balance? Automatic notifications are sent to the email address of the primary contact of the student twice weekly (Wednesday and Saturday evenings) for students whose balance falls below \$5.00. You can also view account balances 24/7 at <https://www.familyportal.cloud/>. *A link to this site is available on the district's website (*OUR DISTRICT / FOOD SERVICE / then scroll down to the right under the IMPORTANT LINKS heading*). *Again, you may experience technical difficulties, which we are working on.

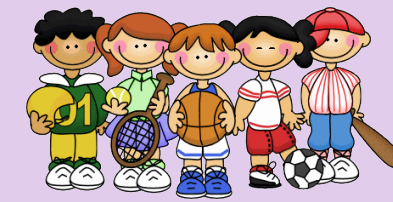
