The Mission of AVID

AVID's mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in global society. Students will be afforded the opportunity to do the following:

- **succeed in rigorous curriculum,**
- **enter mainstream activities of the school,**
- **increase their enrollment in four-year colleges, and**
- **become educated and responsible participants and leaders in a democratic society.**

What is AVID?

AVID is an academic, regularly scheduled elective class based on writing as a tool of learning, inquiry method, and collaborative grouping. The three main components of the program are:

- academic instruction,
- tutorial support,
- and motivational activities.

How does the AVID program contribute to the success of the students

- Teaches study and organizational skills
- Uses English as a writing tool for learning
- Strengthens their writing skills
- Gives tutorial help through college tutors
- Teaches students to work collaboratively to be successful in the most rigorous courses
- Takes students to visit colleges and universities
- Assists students with the application process for four year colleges and universities
- Helps students explore careers through guest speakers





How can parents help?

- Discuss upcoming family events and dates and mark on student calendar.
- Discuss with students selection of tutoring group they will join on tutoring day.
- Occasionally review a page of notes.
- Use questions developed by students to help review for concepts and tests.
- Share your struggles to be organized and encourage students to take time to keep binder organized.

AVID teaches SQ3R and uses The Cornell Note-Taking System to take notes

S
Q
3
R

= Survey the reading selection.

= Create questions to be answered based on reading selection.

– Read, Recite/Write, Review.

- Read either at your own pace or according to teacher direction
- Recite/Write key words or phrases from the selection and answer the questions you developed.
- Self assess: recite what you wrote- do you know the material?
(Repeat as needed)



Cornell Note-Taking System

Students will learn how to organize their notes using the Cornell Note-Taking System

- Divide their paper
- Pull key points out of lecture or text
- Write notes on key points (not narratives or full sentences!)
- Use key points and notes to write a summary of the material.

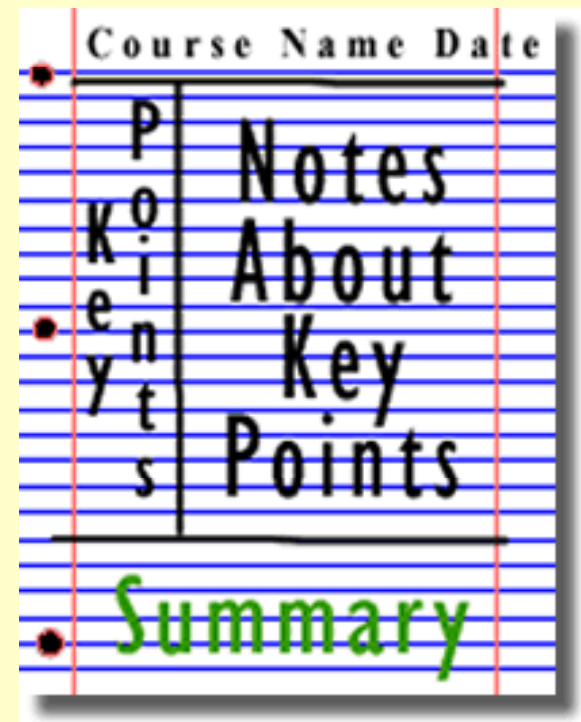

What are Monroe Township Board of Education's Current College Requirements?

In order to graduate from Monroe Township High School, a student must obtain a minimum of 125 credits in grades 9-12. In addition, the successful completion of certain subjects is required as follows:






MTHS Graduation Requirements

- 5 Credits Health and Physical Education for Each School year enrolled
- 20 Credits Language Arts
- 20 Credits Mathematics *
- 5 Credits Technology or Fourth Years of Science
- 15 Credits Science - Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- 15 Credits Social Studies
- 10 Credits Performing Practical or Visual Arts
- 10 Credits World Languages
- Mandated tests set forth by the State

* The fourth year of Mathematics may be fulfilled by taking a computer course in either the Business or Math Departments or an Accounting course.
