Purchase a play-a-long book

Whether your student loves music from Star Wars, Harry Potter, Broadway musicals or big band jazz, there are several play-a-long books that make practicing fun. Ask your director before purchasing a book to ensure that it is the right level for your student.

BAND GIFT IDEAS BY INSTRUMENT:

Flute

- Thumbport (allows student to have hand in correct position for better playing)
- Silk Swab to clean out flute
- Flute Stand (student can keep flute put together while practicing)
- Protec or Accent Case

Oboe

- Fox reed case (holds 3 reeds and allows for optimal drying)
- Lesher Medium Oboe Reeds
- Oboe Stand (student can keep oboe put together while practicing)
- Silk swab to clean out oboe

Bassoon

- Fox reed case (holds 3 reeds and allows for optimal drying)
- Jones Medium Bassoon Reeds (or if your child takes privately, extra reeds from his/her teacher)
- Silk Swab to clean out bassoon

Clarinet

- Boande Inverted ligature (allows reed to vibrate more freely than with conventional metal ligatures. Improves tone, response and intonation
- Reeds (check with your student to see what strength and brand he/she is using)
- Thumbrest (only works for clarinets that do not have a hook for neck straps)
- Rico Reed Storage Case (holds 8 reeds and allows for optimal drying)
- Clarinet Stand (student can keep clarinet put together while practicing)
- Protec or Accent Case

Bass Clarinet

- D'Addario Select Jazz Unfiled reeds (strength 3 medium) for Tenor Sax
- Rico Reed Storage Case (holds 8 reeds and allows for optimal drying)
- Mouthpiece Pouch ProTech or Neo Tech (protects mouthpiece and keeps it clean)

Percussion

- Stick Bag (helps percussionists take ownership over their sticks and mallets. Start with a pair of marimba mallets, timpani mallets and xylo mallets. Ask your director for specific recommendations)
- Metronome Boss DB30
- Pitch Pipe Kratt Tuner
- Tenor practice pad (for aspiring high school drumline tenor players
- Brushes (for drumset players)

Saxophone

- Rovner ligature dark or light is fine (allows reed to vibrate more freely than with conventional metal ligatures. Improves tone, response and intonation)
- La Voz Medium or D'Addario Select Jazz Unfiled reeds (strength 3 medium)
- Rico Reed Storage Case (holds 8 reeds and allows for optimal drying)
- Rico Neck strap (has less elasticity than the Neotech which helps to have the saxophone in the correct position)
- Saxophone Stand (student can keep clarinet put together while practicing)
- Mouthpiece Pouch (for bari or tenor) ProTech or Neo Tech (protects mouthpiece and keeps it clean)

Trumpet

- Valve Oil (Biank Pro, Blue Juice, or West Music)
- Straight Mute (Dennis Wick, Bach, or Tom Crown) Valve Cover
- Trumpet Stand (student can keep trumpet put together while practicing)

Horn

- Rotor Oil
- Valve Cover
- Mouthpiece Pouch ProTech or NeoTech (protects mouthpiece and keeps it clean)

Trombone

- Trombone Slide-O- Mix
- Straight Mute (Dennis Wick, Bach, or Tom Crown)
- Trombone Stand (student can keep trombone put together while practicing)

Tuba

• Valve Oil (Biank Pro, Blue Juice, or West Music) Mouthpiece Pouch - ProTech or NeoTech (protects mouthpiece and keeps it clean)



DIRECTOR SPOTLIGHT: MR. KEVIN MAKINSTER

Kevin Makinster is currently the Director of Fifth Grade Bands at Linn-Mar Community Schools, a position he has held since 2000. In his 35th year of teaching, he began his career in 1985, spending seven years as Band Director at Midland High School in Wyoming, Iowa before coming to Linn-Mar where he served as Associate Director of High School Bands for eight years before becoming the 5th Grade director. Mr. Makinster, a Linn-Mar alum, is a 1985 graduate of UNI (BME), and received his Master of Arts in Teaching degree from Coe College. He has served as President of the North East Iowa Bandmasters Association and was awarded the "Phillip Sehmann Excellence in Teaching Award" from NEIBA in 2006. Kevin is active in Eastern Iowa as a guest conductor and adjudicator/clinician. He has served as a guest conductor for the Marion, 5 Seasons, Coe College, NEIBA MS and SEIBA Elementary Honor Bands, as well as several High School and Middle School conference Honor Bands. He is also an adjudicator for NEIBA Large Group, Jazz Band, and Solo Contests, as well as the Cedar Rapids City Contest. He has served as a clinician/adjudicator at High School Marching Band contests in Marion, Cedar Rapids, Iowa City and Bloomfield and performs regularly on the Trumpet in the Cedar Rapids area. In addition, he teaches Instrumental Methods/Techniques classes at Mount Mercy University and assists with the MMU Concert Band. He has also played French Horn, Clarinet and Percussion in the MMU Concert Band where area Band Directors receive Graduate/Recertification credit to improve their teaching by playing secondary instruments in a Concert Band setting, as well as playing Trumpet in their Jazz Band.
