Beowulf Introductory Activity Introductory Description:

Beowulf is an Anglo-Saxon epic poem, the most important work of Old English literature and one of the earliest extant poems in modern times. The only surviving manuscript was discovered in the 17th century by the English antiquarian, Sir Robert Cotton (1571-1631). It has been preserved since 1753 in the Codex Vittelius AXV in the British Museum.

The somber story is told in vigorous, picturesque language, with much use of metaphors. It tells of a hero, a Scandinavian prince named Beowulf, who rids the Danes of the monster Grendel, half man and half fiend. Fifty years later, Beowulf succeeds in repeating these exploits, freeing his own land from devastation.

Beowulf has been published and translated into modern English frequently since 1833, sometimes in prose.
