Bellbrook High School Students Lead the Way in Community Service

At Bellbrook High School, students and organizations are making a significant impact through various community service projects. From supporting local families to fostering inclusion, these efforts showcase Bellbrook High School's dedication to student service and leadership.

Key Club: Serving with Heart

The Key Club has been busy helping both the local and global community this year:

- **Food Assistance:** Members collected donations and packed brown paper bags of food for students at BCI and Stephen Bell Elementary, ensuring no child goes hungry.
- **Holiday Giving:** Participated in Operation Christmas Child by shopping for and packaging shoeboxes filled with essentials and gifts for children in need around the world.
- **Local Deliveries:** Volunteered at the Bellbrook Community Center, delivering groceries to families in the area.

AFJROTC: Dedication in Action

The Air Force Junior ROTC program at Bellbrook High School focuses on "Developing Citizens of Character," and its cadets exemplify this mission through their extraordinary service:

- **Community Food Drive:** The cadets' annual food drive, spanning October through December, has already collected over **9,157 non-perishable items weighing 7,628 lbs**, enough to provide **6,300 meals**—and **260 lbs of household goods**.
- **Volunteerism:** With 1,213 hours of service logged so far this school year, cadets are making a real difference in the Bellbrook community.
- **Upcoming Drives:** The final food collection event of the year is set for December 14th, further supporting the Bellbrook Sugarcreek Community Support Center.

The Other TP: Empowering Women in Need

During the Homecoming game, The Other TP organized a drive to collect feminine products for three charities:

- **Artemis House:** Supporting victims of domestic violence.
- **The Broken Bus Dayton:** Helping individuals experiencing homelessness.
- **St. Vincent's Women and Family Shelter:** Providing essential items for women and families in need.

The group dedicated 20 hours to this project and continues to volunteer throughout the year.

Kindness Club: Spreading Positivity

The Kindness Club meets monthly to engage in meaningful acts of service:

- Past projects include organizing food drives, creating blankets for homeless shelters, crafting cards for hospitals and nursing homes, maintaining the school garden, and painting rocks with uplifting messages for the school campus. Through these efforts, the Kindness Club is creating a ripple effect of compassion and care throughout the community

National Honor Society: Leaders in Service

The Bellbrook chapter of the National Honor Society has made an incredible impact, contributing **4,500 hours of service** so far this school year:

- Members have worked with local organizations like the Lions Club, Bellbrook Parks District, and Bellbrook United Methodist Church.
- In addition to service, members maintain a minimum GPA of 3.51 and demonstrate leadership and character in all they do.
- From assisting with park clean-ups to hosting community events, NHS members play a vital role in strengthening local connections.

Supportive Peers: Building an Inclusive Community

The Supportive Peers program connects students with those in the district's special education program, fostering relationships and promoting inclusion:

- Each year, nearly 150 lead peers volunteer over **15,000 hours**, in school and during community events.
- Upcoming events include **Saturday with Santa on December 14th** and the **Little Sweetheart Dance on February 8th**.
- Through these connections, students create meaningful friendships while breaking down barriers to promote a truly inclusive community.

New Peer Tutoring Room Supports Academic Success

This year, Bellbrook introduced a peer tutoring room in the library, where students can receive help in various subjects. Nearly 150 students have already benefitted from this resource, which is available every school day.

BHS EXAM POLICIES

1st SEMESTER EXAMS 12/17-12/20 All students are to attend school for the entire period in which they have an exam. Students will not be released until the testing period concludes. If students finish prior to the end of the period they are advised to bring study materials to prepare for their additional exams. An exam grade is worth 20% of the student's grade for a semester course and roughly 10% for a year-long course. An unexcused absence during an exam period will result in a failing grade for the exam. Only absences cleared by a doctor or by administration in advance will be excused. In other words, please make sure students attend their exams.

On exam days, students are only required to be in school during a period that they have an exam. Students are permitted to scan out after they have completed their final exam of the day. If students wish to remain in school when they do not have an exam, a study hall may be provided for them.

BHS EXAM POLICY Exams will be administered at the conclusion of each semester. Exams will be worth 20% of the grade for the semester. A schedule will be provided for students prior to the administering of the tests. Each semester, all students will be awarded one exam exemption that they may use in a single class where they have earned an "A" or "A+" in each quarter of the semester. No "A-" in any quarter in a semester. Students may not exempt the same exam in both semesters. Students may not use an exam exemption in an AP class 1st semester. Students are expected to take their exams on the day and during the period that the exam is scheduled. Exam exemptions apply to BHS courses only, not College Credit Plus courses. Students will lose the privilege of their exam exemption under the following conditions:

1. A student receives office discipline of: 3+ detentions, a Saturday school, in-school studies, or out-of-school suspension during the semester.
2. A student has reached the threshold of Excessively Absent or Habitually Truant

Students who have met exemption discipline and attendance standards will be given an exemption card the week prior to exams. Students will give that card to the teacher whose class exam they are qualified to exempt.

E+R=O IS HOW THE WORLD WORKS

Here's the heart of it:

- Events happen. Life throws us curveballs—some good, some not-so-good. While we can sometimes influence what happens, we can't control everything.
- Responses are up to us. How we choose to react is 100% within our control. No matter the situation, our actions, decisions, and mindset are ours to own.
- Outcomes follow. The results we see in life stem from the quality of our responses. Better responses lead to better outcomes.

It's easy to think, "This situation is out of my hands," but that's not the whole story. While you may not control the event, you always control your response. Every choice you make shapes the results you experience.

And here's the best part: even when things don't go as planned, you can choose to respond differently, try again, and work toward a better outcome. Success often takes patience, persistence, and intentional effort.

So, as we navigate the remainder of the school year together, let's keep this equation in mind: $E+R=O$. Life will always bring challenges, but by focusing on how we respond, we can create positive outcomes—for ourselves, our students, and our community.

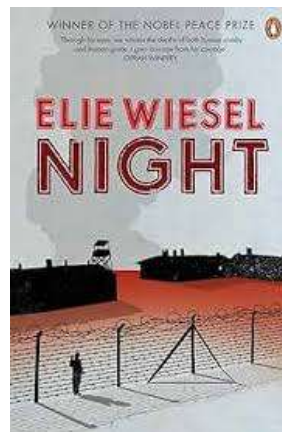
Bellbrook English Classes Highlight Literature, Writing, and Life Prep

Bellbrook High School's English classes are busy with exciting projects, great books, and a lot of learning. Here's a quick update on what students are working on right now:

Freshmen are reading *Night* by Elie Wiesel and learning about Holocaust literature. They're exploring powerful themes like survival and humanity. English 9 Honors students just finished *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak and wrote essays about the book's themes and characters.

Sophomores are diving into Shakespeare's *Macbeth*. They're exploring big ideas like ambition, power, and how choices can have huge consequences.

Juniors in **English 11 CP** recently studied writers like Ralph Waldo Emerson and Henry David Thoreau and wrapped it up with essays about their ideas. Others just finished *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller and are starting a new unit called "The Individual and Society: The American Renaissance." They'll be looking at famous American writers like Emily Dickinson and Walt Whitman.



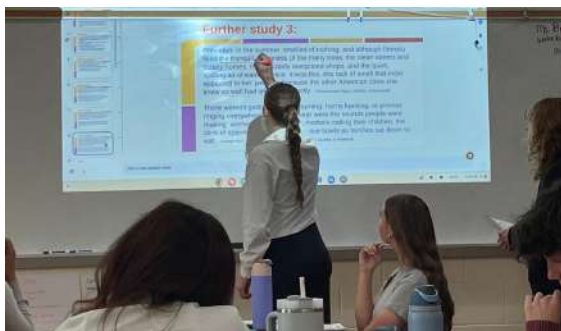
Seniors in **English 12 CP** are completing a unit all about professionalism where they worked on resumes, practiced mock interviews, and learned about real-world workplace issues.

AP Language students are working on open argument essays for the AP exam, building on what they learned last quarter about rhetorical skills. **AP Literature** students are sharpening their writing skills to tackle the Free Response essays for the AP exam and their Common Application essays. Previously they learned about literary devices and techniques for both poetry and prose

Electives: Journalism, Yearbook, and Film

- **Journalism:** The EagleView News team is hard at work covering school and community news, while The Egg podcast team is talking about what matters to Gen Z. Check out eagleviewnews.com to see what they've been up to!
- **Yearbook:** The yearbook staff is busy working on this year's book and completing weekly writing assignments.
- **Film:** Film students are wrapping up their Western movie study and getting ready to jump into the Gangster genre next.

Whether students are reading classic books, practicing real-world skills, or creating something amazing in electives, there's always something exciting happening in our English classes. Stay tuned to see what they'll do next!

From Concepts to Creations: Art Classes Celebrate Diverse Projects!

Students in **Art 1** finished out the Halloween season with neon skull paintings! They learned about colors and contrast while creating fun festive skulls. Next up, tiny clay huts that demonstrate students' understanding of creating 3D textures!



Students in **Art 3** recently finished full value skull drawings on a colorful mixed media background! Now they are working on "Thrift Store Paintings". They find an old painting and add to it with paint. They can create funny, silly, scary, or realistic scenes.



Art 4 is working with a new material- thickening medium! They are using a round canvas to create a "plate" with an intricate design, a realistic looking food, and paint mixed with thickening medium to create a 3D look...think cream cheese, icing, or whipped cream!

Career Arts is learning about commercial photography, specifically food photography. They learned what types of jobs they could have and what paths to take to achieve those jobs. Then, students created a "photoshoot" complete with real food, a backdrop, and staged lighting. The students used tricks like using glue for milk, an upside down cup in a bowl of soup for the garnishes to rest on, dish soap in soda for foam, and much more.



Cultural Arts just finished studying Moroccan Khamisa's Hands, which are a hand-shaped good luck charm or amulet. They created their pieces in clay and learned how to utilize both additive and subtractive techniques in their work. They also studied The Day of the Dead (el Día de los Muertos), which is a Mexican holiday where families welcome back the souls of their deceased relatives for a brief reunion that includes food, drink and celebration. Students created their own Sugar Skull designs, and learned how to recreate their designs in 3D using felt and multiple embroidery techniques.
