Message From The

SUPERINTENDENT

Dear District Residents,

On behalf of the Board of Education, students and staff of Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools, we are pleased to present our **inaugural Quality Profile**.

There were a lot of successes in the 2018-19 school year, and you will see many of them reflected throughout this publication. We are always focused on providing a well-rounded experience that empowers our learners to be responsible decision-makers and effective problem-solvers; persevere in the achievement of life goals; contribute to communities locally and beyond; and embrace learning as a lifelong process.

Not only do our outstanding, dedicated teachers and staff do an excellent job educating our children, the district is consistently recognized for this effort and ranked among the best locally and across the state. We received an "A" on the 2018 State School Report card and were one of only 28 districts in the state to receive this grade. The district's graduation rate of 96.4% earned an "A" on the state report card, student attendance rate is 96.2%, and the number of 3rd graders that met the Third Grade Reading Guarantee was 100%.

Added to that, niche.com recently ranked the district as the #1 public school district in Greene County; #1 as the best place to teach in Greene County; and #3 as the safest school districts in the Dayton area. Additionally, U.S. News & World Report recently ranked Bellbrook High School in the top 10% of Ohio high schools and #3 in the Dayton area.

These are incredible accomplishments that reflect the incredible commitment we have to our students and to this community.

I am proud of all of this work, but the single most important issue facing our schools right now is our budget. Last year, we cut and reduced our budget while continuing to operate on fewer dollars and balancing fairly flat revenue and inflationary cost increases. And with the loss at the ballot this past May, we are to the point where cuts and reductions are hitting straight to the classroom and student experience. There is no way around it - much like one's home budget we simply cannot fund what we can no longer afford.

So while we reflect on some highlights from last school year, we must also keep in mind that this will be a critical, defining year for Bellbrook-Sugarcreek Schools. I promise to keep you informed about what is happening in our schools as well as decisions we will have to make as a community – after all, these schools belong to the community and your input and involvement is critical to their success.

I am honored to serve as your superintendent and I look forward to what the future has in store for us.


