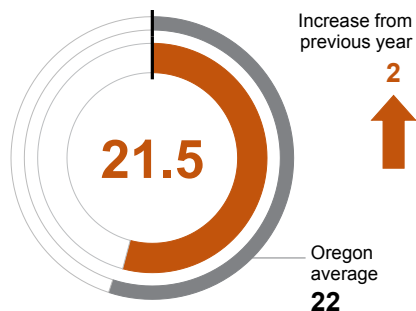

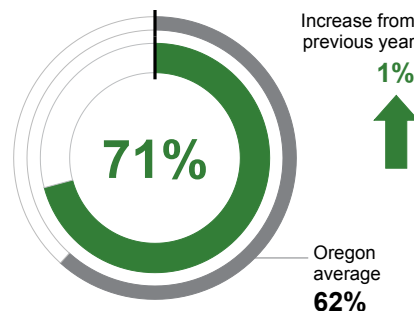
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

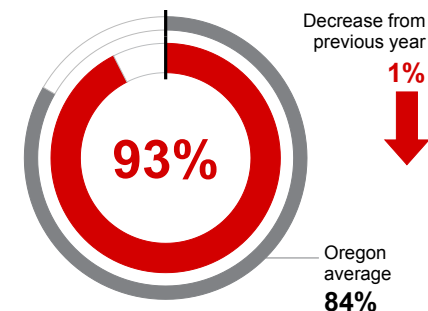
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

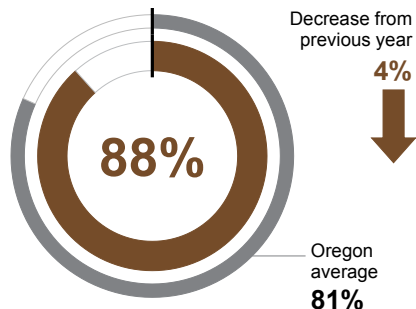
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

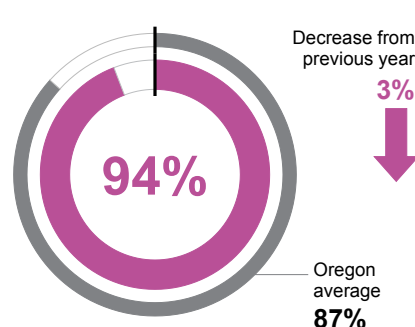
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



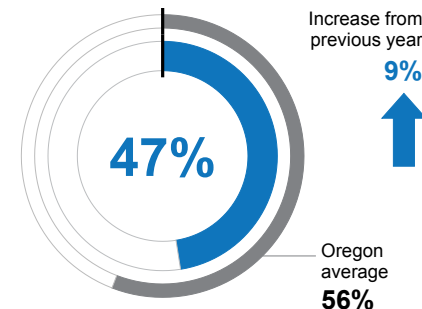
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We have activities to help students transition successfully to high school and graduate in four years. We start each school year with a new student orientation to welcome students. We advertise and use SafeOregon as a resource to report concerns. We use a weekly advisory period for all students to attend to their social and emotional health and wellbeing.

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Advanced Coursework
Our school offers many dual credit, AP and Honors courses for our students in grades 9-12.
AP courses - Calculus, Biology, Environmental Science, Human Geography, Economics, Government, English Literature, and Psychology
Honors - English 9, 10, and 12.
Dual Credit - Agricultural Technology, Animal Science, Design Seminar, Film & Video, Graphic Design, Honors English 12, Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus, Welding 2.
We partner with College Board, NWRES, Portland Community College, Western Oregon University, and Tillamook Bay Community College to offer college credit for high school classes.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

We offer two strands of Career and Technical Education. In each strand students can take several courses for high school and college credit:
- Applied Arts: Intro to Multimedia, Graphic Design, Film & Video, Media Arts, and Design Seminar
- Agriculture/Manufacturing: Intro to Agriculture, Welding, Metal Fabrication, Agricultural Technology, Horticulture, Veterinary Science, Supervised Agricultural Experience, Agricultural Business Management.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We offer several clubs, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities. Many of these activities have had a great deal of success. Many of our students participate in one or more of the activities offered.
Clubs and Co-Curricular Teams: Anime, National Honor Society, Drama, Robotics, Garden, Leadership, Native Club, Fabrication & Design, Future Farmers of America, Gender Sexuality Alliance, Trap Club, Choir, Band, and Percussion.
Extra-curricular: Cross Country, Soccer, Football, Volleyball, Wrestling, Dance and Drill, Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Track, Golf, and Equestrian.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We provide several newsletters throughout the year to parents. We maintain a social media presence to keep stakeholders informed about upcoming events and celebrate successes. We partner with several community partners for a Career Day to help students plan and prepare to be college and career ready. We offer several events throughout the school year for parents including: parent-teacher conferences, financial aid night, 8th grade parent night, awards night, and mock interviews. We have a Parents' Association who meet monthly to support students and programs.
