



Tint is when you add white to a color which will make your color lighter in value.

Shades are when you add black to a color which will make the color darker in value

Tone is when you add gray to a color which will mute the intensity (the brightness of it which will make the color duller.

Adding value to a 2D shape can make it look like a 3D form. This is called shading using a wide range of values. There are a variety of different methods that can be used for shading.






Value

- Value is an element of design.
- Value is defined as the lights and darks in an art work.
- Value can be black, white and ranges of grays or it can be a color and the lights(tints) and darks (shades) of that color.


Proportion- Definition

Proportion is the relationship between objects, or parts, of a whole.






Distortion of Proportions






Closed corner



BLACK AND WHITE PICTURE CONTINUATION

- 1. Find a black and white photo cut a 2"x2" section of it out. IMMEDIATELY throw away the unused/other part.
- 2. Using one small piece of rolled tape, tape photo section on the center and slightly to the left or right side of the scratch paper.
- 3. On the Manila/Scratch paper, sketch out ideas on how you would complete the original piece of artwork on all 4 sides.
- 4. Be sure that each side connects and is related to the photo section.
- 5. Get sketches approved by your teacher before starting the final.

- 6. Using one small piece of rolled tape, tape photo section on final paper.
- 7. On the white paper, sketch out your final picture.
- 8. Be sure that the positive and negative spaces are balanced. ADD DETAILS
- 9. Using a variety of values to shade with. Shade your sketch accurately. MATCH VALUES AND PROPORTIONS to the picture.
- 10. Be creative, think about your Composition
- 11. Final step: Glue the photo section on to your finished original work of art.
