At Blackburn, we remain committed to the following safety protocols as we **Return to Learn**:


Blackburn Middle School Vision

1:1 CHROMEBOOK



At Blackburn, every scholar is issued a Chromebook. Students have access to Chromebooks 24/7, and are permitted to use the device outside of the school building.
