School Year – BMHS offers a modern curriculum on a 5-block system to 9 – 12 graders. Using a class schedule that consists of three 80-minute courses, one for minutes course or intervention period and either one 85 minute course or two 40 minute courses. The schedule allows students to earn up to 9 credits per academic year.
