Wes Armbruster has been named the new Head Coach of the Girls Cross Country team. Coach Armbruster has been an assistant cross country coach for the past ten years winning 9 state championships (8 boys, 1 girls) and 2 additional state trophies (1 boys, 1 girls). He has been the Head Coach for the Girls Track and Field team for the past 5 years, after having served the previous 5 as an assistant. Prior to coming to Festus, Coach Armbruster was the head cross country coach at Perryville High School from 2004-2006 leading the girls to a District championship
