

Requirements:

- ❑ Treat 2021 like it's a person. Write DIRECTLY to 2021 (Be honest—tell 2021 exactly what it did right, wrong, and why you are moving on.)

- ❑ 3 paragraphs including salutation (greeting and closing)

Paragraph 1—positives of 2021

Paragraph 2—what you are leaving behind in 2021

Paragraph 3—goals/looking forward to 2022

- ❑ Avoid text lingo (text message words) and use appropriate spelling, grammar, and sentence structure.

- ❑ Transition from one sentence to the next and explain your reasons and ideas.

- ❑ This should not read like a list.

- ❑ Most importantly, let your personality shine through and be CREATIVE!

- ❑ You will type your letter in a Google doc, therefore you have access to a spell checker. You can also use Google to look up the spelling of words.

- ❑ This is due at the end of class today, and it is for a grade. Do your best work and have fun with it.

(List your goals/dreams/hopes for this year)

(List things you want to complete/achieve/do in 2022)
