# NEW STAFF ENGAGE IN TRAINING TO START THE YEAR

Our Instructional Coaches have been busy supporting teachers by providing professional development, coteaching, and modeling! While their main focus so far has been on supporting new teachers, they have also worked with veteran teachers to implement new programs and share new resources.







#### **BCPS TRANSPORTATION FOCUSES SCHOOL BUS SAFETY**

Over 1,000 students ride a BCPS bus each day, and the division's Transportation Department has a primary focus on safety. The most dangerous time during a bus route is when the bus stops to load or unload students. Before a school bus stops, the driver turns on the amber warning lights. The warning lights should give motorists time to slow down and prepare to stop, but sometimes they speed up to pass the bus before the red stop lights and the stop sign are activated.

When vehicles pass the bus in this way, it puts children in danger. We urge all drivers to use caution when approaching school buses.

Multiple agencies play a role in keeping bus routes safe for students. BCPS works with the Virginia Department of Transportation to identify areas where school bus stop ahead signs are needed, or where tall grass and brush obstructs views and needs to be cut down. The Brunswick County Sheriff's Office patrols roadways where bus drivers report aggressive drivers, while Virginia State Police Troopers provide safety training for bus drivers each year and also patrol the roads.


BCPS purchased and installed stop-arm cameras on school buses in 2021. The camera records the license plate, time, date, and GPS location when a vehicle passes a stopped school bus. BCSO Sgt. Shavonda Stith has used the stop arm camera video to issue traffic tickets, which can lead to serious consequences and fines in court.

"We all share the responsibility of keeping our children safe while they are traveling by bus," Sgt. Stith says. "Please be alert while driving and make sure to stop for all buses. Our children are precious cargo, and we want them to get to school and return home safely."

Parents, please review this list of bus stop safety strategies with your children:

- Use flashlights and reflectors to increase visibility
- Wait at least 10 feet from the roadway until the bus comes to a complete stop
- · Look in both directions before walking into a road
- Wait for the driver to signal that it is safe to cross the road
- Stay out of the danger zone and walk 10 feet away from the front of bus while crossing
- Never walk behind the bus

Together, we can ensure the safety of all students when they're riding the bus each day!

### **FBLA STUDENTS EARN HONORS**



Our Maintenance team has been hard at work improving our schools' safety, energy efficiency, comfort, and appearance. The department recently completed its Virginia Department of Environmental Quality water quality testing. Team members also performed maintenance to increase door security at each school site, and have started servicing the boilers and heating systems to be ready for the winter months.

The Virginia State Fire Marshal's inspection has been completed, and all our schools are in compliance.

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM TRANSPORTATION



The BCPS Transportation staff has been busy making sure all our students get a safe ride to and from school each day. This was the first summer BCPS has ever started the school year with air-conditioned buses. We purchased 10 new buses with AC last year, and had AC installed on six other buses this year. Almost half of our buses now have AC systems!

The division ordered five new diesel school buses in September, and we hope to have them delivered by early 2023. We submitted an application for the EPA Clean School Bus Program. This grant can be used to pay for electric school buses, and BCPS was considered a priority school district for the grant. The award announcements will be in October.

Finally, congratulations to Mrs. Myra Saylor, who drives for Meherrin-Powellton Elementary School. Mrs. Saylor will travel to a luncheon in Richmond on October 10 to receive an award as a Virginia Stellar Bus Driver from the Lucian Hunter Foundation of Hope!
